

Who Am I?

- I was a famous American scientist and inventor
- I served as the American diplomat to France during the American Revolution
- I helped write the Declaration of Independence and U.S. Constitution
- I published *Poor Richard's Almanack*

Who Am I?

- I opposed British taxation of the colonies
- I was a member of the Continental Congress from Massachusetts
- I organized the Sons of Liberty
- I was a leader of the colonial "Indians" at the Boston Tea Party

Who Am I?

- I started the French and Indian War when I was only 21
- I was president of the Constitutional Convention in 1787
- I commanded the colonial army during the American Revolution
- I was the first President of the United States

Who Am I?

- I became the head of the Democratic-Republican party in the 1790s
- I founded the University of Virginia
- I served as the third President of the United States
- I wrote the Declaration of Independence

Who Am I?

I was born a slave in Maryland
I escaped from slavery and became a spokesman for the abolition of slavery
After the Civil War I served as mayor of Washington, D.C.
I wrote my autobiography to describe the evils and horrors of slavery

Who Am I?

- I was the leading propagandist of the American Revolution
- I was imprisoned in France because of my radical writings
- I wrote the *Crisis* papers to support the American Revolution
- I wrote *Common Sense* in 1776 to gain support for American Independence

Who Am I?

- I reigned as king for 60 years
- I went insane in my last years of life
- I enforced royal authority throughout my reign
- I was king of England during the American Revolution

Who Am I?

- I was known as "Old Hickory"
- I was a symbol of the rise of the common man in American history
- I served as president of the United States from 1829 to 1837
- I won the Battle of New Orleans in 1815

- I supported a protective tariff and national improvements after the War of 1812
- I served as Vice President of the United States from 1825 to 1832
- I served as Senator from South Carolina until my death in 1850
- I was a spokesman for states' rights and the nullification of federal laws

- I served twice as Secretary of State
- I was a representative and senator from Massachusetts in Congress
- I was an excellent speaker and voiced my opposition to slavery and secession
- I negotiated the Webster-Ashburton Treaty in 1842

Who Am I?

I lost elections for President of the United States in 1824, 1832, and 1844
 I served as Speaker of the House for 13 years and in the Senate for 11 years
 I helped to pass the Missouri Compromise and the Compromise of 1850
 I am known as the "Great Compromiser"

Who Am I?

- I was born poor but became a successful lawyer in Illinois
- I was a founder of the Republican party in the mid 1850s
- I was assassinated at Ford's Theater in 1865
- I was President of the United States during the Civil War

Who Am I?

- I served as the first secretary of treasury under President Washington
- I served as General Washington's aide-de-camp during the American Revolution
- I was killed in a duel with Aaron Burr
- I helped to end America's financial difficulties and establish the Bank of the United States

Who Am I?

- I graduated from West Point and served in the Mexican War
- I served as president of Washington and Lee University after the Civil War
- In the Civil War I turned down command of the U.S. Army to serve Virginia
- I was commander-in-chief of the Confederate Army during the Civil War

Who Am I?

- I was a representative and senator from Mississippi in Congress
- I served as secretary of war in the 1850s
- I was a strong supporter of states' rights
- I was the only president of the Confederate States of America

Who Am I?

- I graduated from West Point and served in the Mexican War
- I served as President of the United States from 1869 to 1877
- I won the Battle of Vicksburg in 1863
- I commanded the Union Army that defeated the Southern Army in 1865

- I served as first governor of the state of Virginia during the Revolution
- I was a leader in Virginia against British taxation without representation
- I opposed the U.S. Constitution because it limited the power of the states
- I am remembered for my famous “Give me liberty, or give me death!” speech

- I helped to found the Democratic-Republican party during the 1790s
- I served as Secretary of State under President Jefferson
- I was President of the United States during the War of 1812
- I am known as the “Father of the Constitution” because of my leadership

Who Am I?

- I opposed the U.S. Constitution because the federal government had too power
- I served as Secretary of State during the War of 1812 under President Madison
- I was President of the United States from 1817 to 1825
- I am known for the Monroe Doctrine in American foreign policy

Who Am I?

- I spent all my life seeking equal rights for women
- I married Henry Stanton and was the mother of seven children
- I helped to organize the Seneca Falls Women’s Rights Convention
- I led the adoption of the Declaration of Sentiments for women in 1848

Who Am I?

- I served in the US House of Representatives and as President of Antioch College
- I persuaded Massachusetts to establish a six month school year in 1839
- I served as Secretary of Education for Massachusetts from 1837 to 1848
- I am known as the father of public education in the United States

Who Am I?

- I and my brother Henry Beecher were abolitionists opposed to slavery
- I married Calvin Stowe in 1836 and had seven children
- In 1862 Abraham Lincoln called me “the little lady who made this big war”
- I wrote the anti-slavery novel *Uncle Tom’s Cabin* in 1852
