**Citation.** District discipline data from 2001 – 2002 Summer PEIMS submission and the SAISD data warehouse.

**Abstract.** According to Chapter 37 of the Texas Education Code, Sec. 37.020: *Annually, each district must report, in the manner required by the commissioner of education, information concerning each DAEP placement and each expulsion. Note that, pursuant to the reauthorized Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), districts must also report information concerning in-school and out-of-school suspensions. In accordance with this requirement, the following is the 2001 – 2002 SAISD Discipline Report.*

#### Highlights:

- A total of 99 students were expelled during the 2001 – 2002 school year, while 13 expulsions were carried over from prior year.
- A total of 843 students were placed in disciplinary alternative educational settings during the 2001 – 2002 school year, with 76 students receiving multiple placements.
- Although disciplinary actions totaled 26,356, the number of students receiving these actions was 9,447 or 16% of the total student population.
- African American students represent 10% of the student population, and account for 9% of all DAEP placements, 7% of all expulsions, 16% of all out-of-school suspensions, and 12% of all in-school suspensions.
- Hispanic students represent 86% of the student population, and account for 88% of all DAEP placements, 90% of all expulsions, 80% of all out-of-school suspensions, and 84% of all in-school suspensions.
- White students represent 4 % of the student population, and account for 3 % of all DAEP placements, less than 2% of all expulsions, 4% of all out-of-school suspensions, and 4% of all in-school suspensions.
- Economically Disadvantaged students accounted for 92% of the SAISD student population, and they represented 93% of all actions resulting in DAEP placement.
- Disciplinary actions align with ethnicity and economically disadvantaged status within a range of plus or minus 3 percentage points with only three exceptions that were slightly over this mark. African American students were over represented for out-of-school suspensions at 16%. Hispanic students were over represented for expulsions at 90%, but the removal of one student makes this alignment within the 3% margin. Hispanics were under represented for out-of-school suspensions at 80%.
- Special Education students accounted for 13% of the SAISD student population, and they represented 28% of all actions resulting in DAEP placement, 31% of all

actions resulting in expulsion, 29% of all out of school suspensions, and 24% of all in-school suspensions.

Implications:

- Consideration should be given of practice and procedures in determining disciplinary actions for students within the Special Education program.
