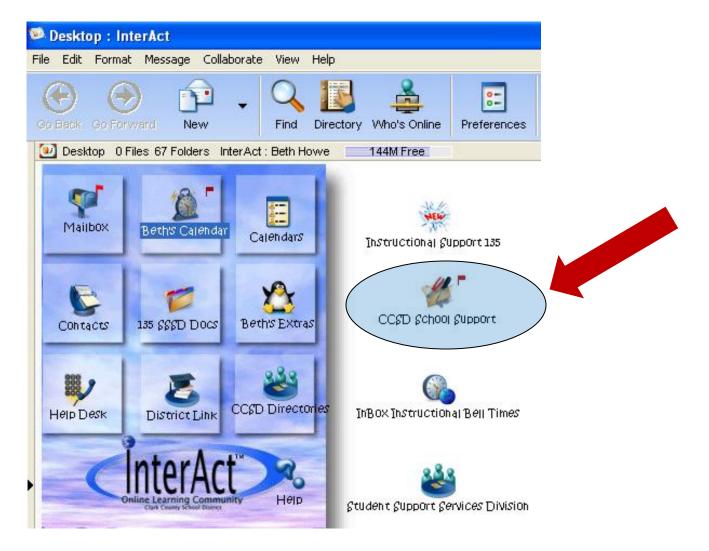

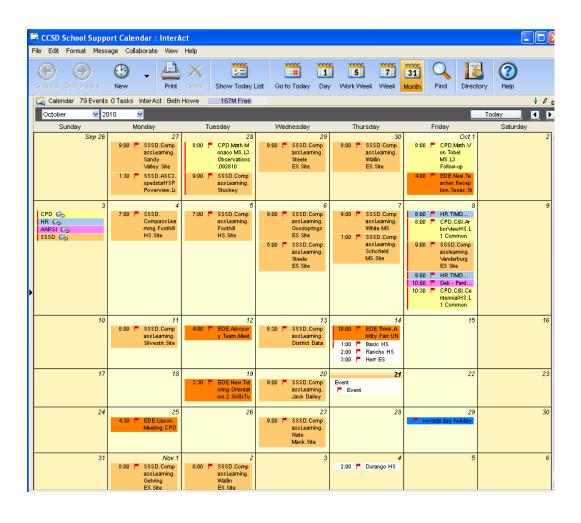


School Support Collaborative Conference Icon Common Calendar to Identify Supports *Provided to Schools

School Support Collaborative Conference Icon Common Calendar to Identify Supports *Provided to Schools

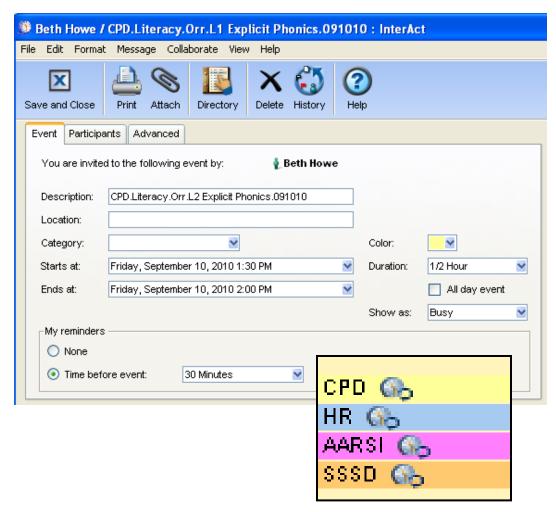


Inside the CCSD School Support Calendar, included are the Districtwide and site-specific sessions and supports.

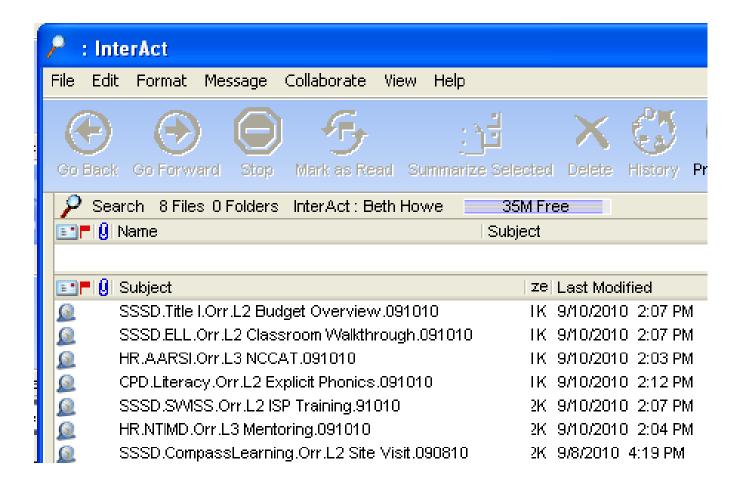

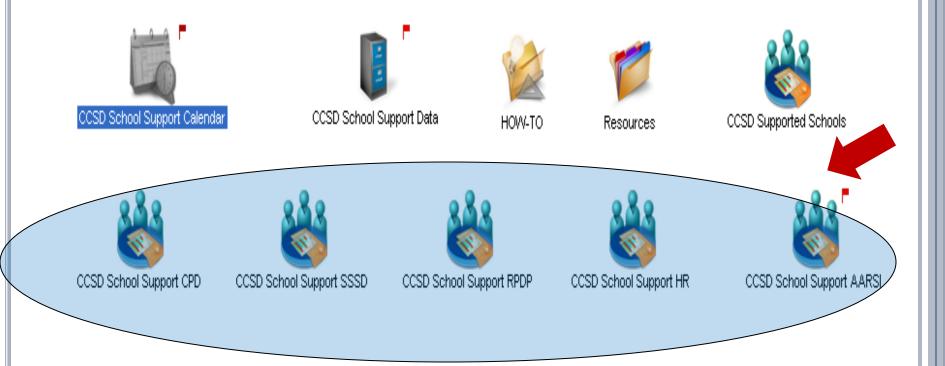

Meeting scheduled for October 14, 2010, at 9:00 AM to look at data of students and determine plan of action. Pat is also collaborating with Katie Amoia regarding Read 180 implementation at the site. Teacher attending all day training on 10/21/10 at Chaparrel HS Worked with Scholastic to add Biltmore to the SSSD Premium Technical Support Plan. Added 60 Read 180 student licenses to the SSSD Server for Biltmore. SSSD Technology Specialist, Grant Gilbert, will offer supports for the ECS at the site. CORE There are currently not any teachers from Biltmore in the CORE Reading Academy for Special Educators. Joanne Vattiato will be setting up a meeting with Maureen Diaz, Kim Sorenson, and Diane Reitz to see how the teachers at Biltmore can be trained with the CORE strategies.

Yesmi Rios	September 30, 2010	The 2 hour professional development covering the topics of accommodations, ELL vocabulary and ELL strategies that will be hosted at Biltmore is being developed. The decision of whether to host the course before school or during school will soon be determined. The 2 hour professional development will be followed up by additional HQSI professional development that will touch on the topics of Scaffolding and Differentiated Instruction.
Norberta Anderson	October 7, 2010	Yesmi Rios is working with Denise Martin on deciding how many word-to word-dictionaries will be ordered for the students at Biltmore. Given that this is being done for all ESD schools, the order will not arrive as quickly as one might expect. Once the professional development has taken place, Yesmi Rios will follow up with additional supplemental materials. The topic of parent engagement has yet to be discussed.
