Don't Quit...



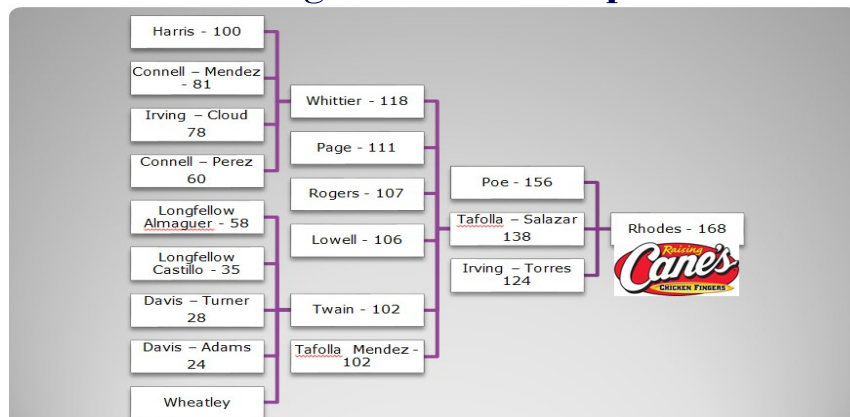
Mr. Samuel Cotton has been making his rounds throughout the Middle School Partners Classrooms motivating the students to “Don't Quit!” Born and raised in Illinois, Samuel Cotton grew up in a dysfunctional home full of alcoholism, family violence, and substance abuse. As a young man, Sam had encounters with law enforcement, was suspended from school on multiple occasions, and was simply “lost”. As a result of a violent act, Sam was arrested at school and during that process the arresting officer began to talk to

Sam about the choices that he was making and tried to gain an understanding of why Sam was doing the things he was doing. Unbeknownst to the officer, that conversation would start a lifetime of change in Sam's life. It was Sam's attempt to help, motivate, and encourage young adults; the same way the arresting officer did for Sam. Mr. Cotton has his Masters Degree in Social Work and he serves as a Behavioral Health provider in the United States Army and will be testing for his clinical license in the near future. Through hard work, determination, loving but troubled parents, and mentors who continued to care when they probably shouldn't have, Sam is now walking in his passion and living his dream of a life of service to others.
