Austin Academy (PK-8) – Performing and Visual Arts 621 W. Euclid Ave., 78212, 210-226-5441 Academic performance, problem-solving skills, and creative thinking are strengthened through the integration of music and the arts with a rigorous curriculum. Starting in kindergarten, students receive a minimum of 90 minutes a week of instruction in music, art, dance and/or drama. Beginning in 4th grade, they also have the choice of several music and visual arts electives.

Barkley-Ruiz (PK-5) – Learning Styles 1111 S. Navidad St., 78207, 210-227-4022 Employs a holistic educational approach custom-made to each child's unique style of learning, with particular concentration on early intervention.

Bonham Academy (PK-8) – Dual Language, Environmental Studies, Fine Arts & Sciences 925 S. St. Mary's St., 78205, 210-223-3741 Students have the opportunity to become fluent in Spanish, Chinese, or Russian as well as to cultivate a life-long appreciation and respect for art, culture and the environment. Education is enhanced through field trips to arts and sciences venues, while they also can learn about native plants and wildlife at the school's outdoor gardens – including a designated National Wildlife Habitat for the monarch butterfly.
