Keynote speaker will be acclaimed inspirational educator and author Erin Gruwell, whose New York Times best-selling book "The Freedom Writers Diary" was the basis for a Hollywood movie.

Gruwell's address will draw upon her own

personal experiences as a first-year teacher who helped her students overcome seemingly insurmountable obstacles.

In 2007 her story made the big screen as the movie "Freedom Writers" starring Hilary Swank and Patrick Dempsey.

Gruwell's appearance will be funded through the SAISD Foundation and H-E-B, which also are underwriting Convocation 2012.

Other guest speakers will include San Antonio's own Henry Cisneros, who prior to serving as the U.S. Housing and Urban Development Secretary between 1993 and '97 was a four-term city mayor.

In addition to setting a tone for and getting employees excited about the new school year, Convocation 2012 will provide the SAISD family a rare opportunity to gather together.

## Search process under way for SAISD's 18th superintendent

If all goes according to schedule, the District could select a new leader in January.

Earlier this summer Trustees hired PROACT Search - a group of more than 100 consultants with experience as educators - to manage the process which will include recruiting qualified candidates.

A key component will be multiple opportunities for gathering public and employee input through public meetings - as well as an online survey to be posted soon on our website.

## Community input sought on proposed redistricting maps

SAISD patrons will have the opportunity to review and comment on proposals to redraw single-member district boundaries.

Two draft maps will be submitted at upcoming public meetings. Draft Map A would impact Districts 3, 4 and 5 while Draft Map B-1 calls for the redrawing of boundaries for Districts 1,2,3,4 and 5.

The redistricting is necessitated by demographic changes as determined by the

2010 Census and proposals are designed to equalize population.

Currently there is a greater than 10 percent difference between District 3 - the most populated - and District 5 - the least populated. These are served by Trustees Debra Guerrero and Patti Radle, respectively.

Hired to oversee the redistricting process is the law firm of Powell & Leon.

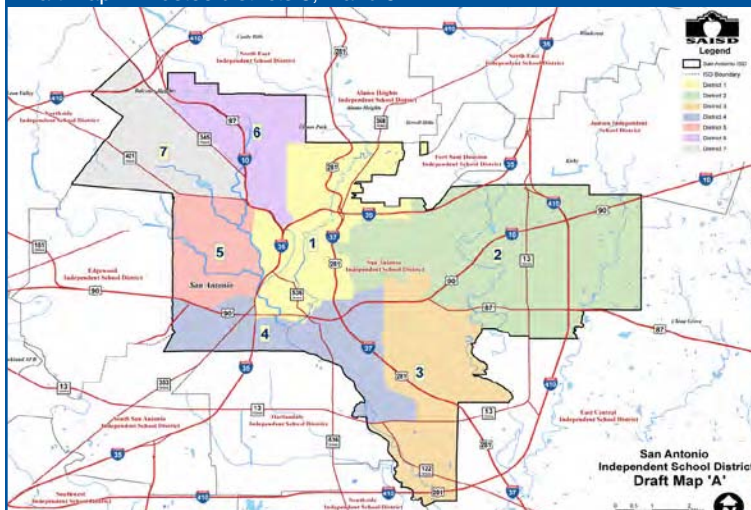

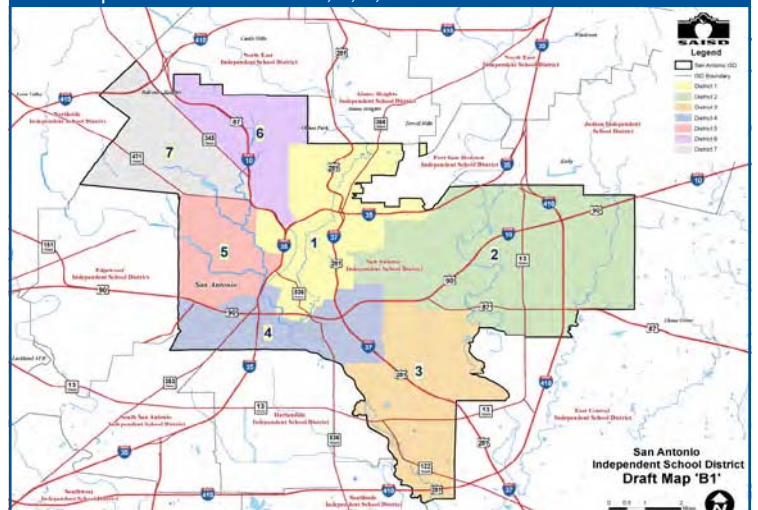
