

What information do I need to file for financial aid?

- Student's and parents' 2012 IRS tax forms and W2s or web link into IRS
- ✓ Student's and parents' social security numbers
- ✓ Student's alien registration number, if applicable
- Student's and parents' untaxed income information (e.g. child support)
- Student's and parents' other financial information (e.g. net worth of business, farm assets, etc.)
- Student's and parents' exact dates of birth
