Go Public campaign celebrates public schools

With SAISD's historic Jefferson HS serving as the backdrop, Superintendent Dr. Sylvester Perez was among representatives of the 15 Bexar County-area school district and business leaders united in a common cause: promoting the benefits of a public school education.

The Go Public campaign, which kicked off earlier this month, will combine social media outreach with radio and TV ads.

"Public schools educate about 90 percent of school-aged children in Bexar County - yet you don't hear often enough about the benefits of public

schools," Perez said.

The yearlong initiative will provide supporters of public schools an opportunity to tell their collective story, Perez said.

"The ads will focus on public education's core strengths: a highly trained and experienced teaching corps, a wide variety of extracurricular activities and clubs and a diversity of learning experiences and technological resources."

Go Public campaign tri-chairs are USAA CEO Gen. Josue (Joe) Robles, CST Brands CEO Kim Bowers and Toyota Motor Manufacturing Texas President

Chris Nielsen. All are products of, and send their children to, public schools.

Perez took advantage of the opportunity to tout some of the host school's highlights since opening amid much fanfare in 1932. Among them being named the "Most Outstanding School in America," appearing on the cover of Life magazine and providing the setting for movies and commercials.

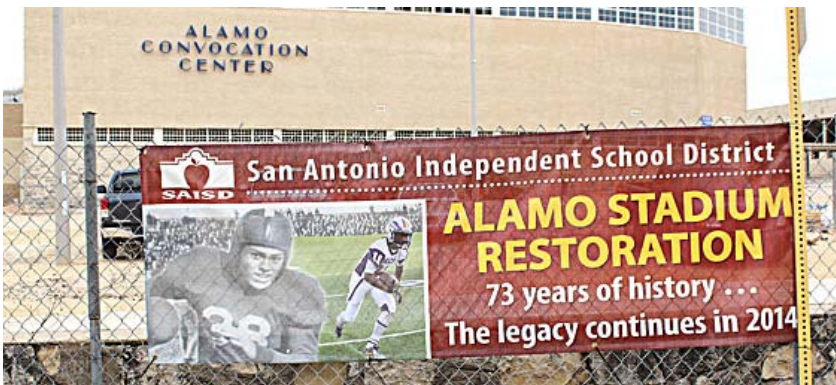
