Four SAISD schools ranked among the area's best

For the second consecutive time Arnold has made the list of top elementaries compiled by Children at Risk, a Houston-based advocacy group. The recently-released report also includes three SAISD academies.

Arnold was joined in the top 10 elementary-level category by

Briscoe.

Placing in the top 10 category for middle schools are Austin and Hawthorne.

More than 400 schools were rated in the greater San Antonio area that included six counties.

Campuses were evaluated on factors including "commended" performance on TAKS, attendance rate, and retention rates to determine how well area schools are preparing their students for secondary and post-secondary success.
