SAISD expecting record-high TAKS scores for 2010

Preliminary test results are in, and the results are cause for major celebration.

Based upon the recently-available Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills academic indicators, we see significant gains in science, measurable improvement in math, *exemplary* performance in social studies and continued *recognized* performance in reading and writing!

Overall, SAISD is *recognized* or *exemplary* in 24 out of the 25 academic measures evaluated.

The preliminary results also indicate that 43 campuses earned either *exemplary* or *recognized* ratings – and no campuses were named unacceptable under academic indicators.

“As we continue to pursue every opportunity

to improve academic performance across the District, it’s gratifying to know that we are making solid progress, and our efforts will continue,” said Superintendent Robert J. Durón.

These preliminary results do not incorporate the impact of the second administration of 5th- and 8th-grade reading and math (that addition could only result in more improvement). The results also do not include SAISD’s dropout and completion data. Final results will be available in late July.

The news is not only encouraging, but timely as well. The District’s academic plan includes the goal of all campuses being ranked *exemplary* or *recognized* by spring 2011.

Preliminary highlights*

- 11 campuses rated *exemplary*
- 32 campuses rated *recognized* (up from 29 in 2009).
- Of our eight traditional high schools: four rated *recognized* and four rated academically acceptable.

* Scores are on academic indicators only.

The nine-year SAISD police officer was honored by the American Society for Industrial Security at the organization’s 20th-Annual Law Enforcement Awards ceremony.

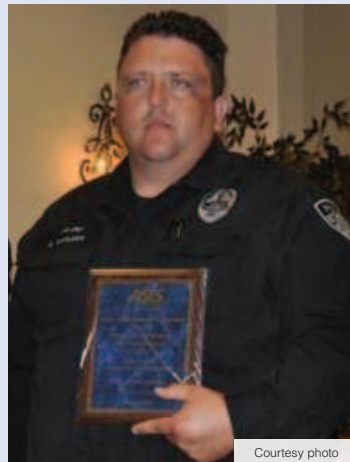
“It has always been my personal goal to make this K-9 team the best possible,” Whitlock said.

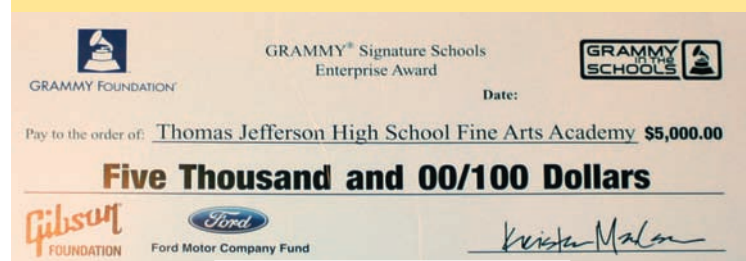


And the GRAMMY goes to
