SAISD Foundation funds one of the largest amounts ever for Innovative Grants

The ingenious ideas of 29 educators soon will reach fruition, thanks to funding from the SAISD Foundation.

Through \$88,333 – one of the largest amounts ever given since the foundation was formed four years ago - recipients will be able to finance specially-designed lessons.

Recipients were announced during a Sept. 1 news conference at Brackenridge HS. The grant for that campus – along with one given to SAISD's math department to purchase teaching equipment for high schools Districtwide – were given in memory of the late Christopher McBrayer, who taught science and math there for 16 years.

Grants also honored retiring foundation board members. These and the beneficiary schools were: Robert Puente, J.T. Brackenridge ES; and Debra Salge, Bonham Academy.

After the announcement, recipients learned of their selection from foundation trustees, SAISD School Board members, alumni and local supporters through surprise visits to their classrooms and offices.

Since the fall of 2007 the SAISD Foundation has awarded a total of \$498,723 through 489 innovative and new teacher supply grants, benefiting 52,885 students

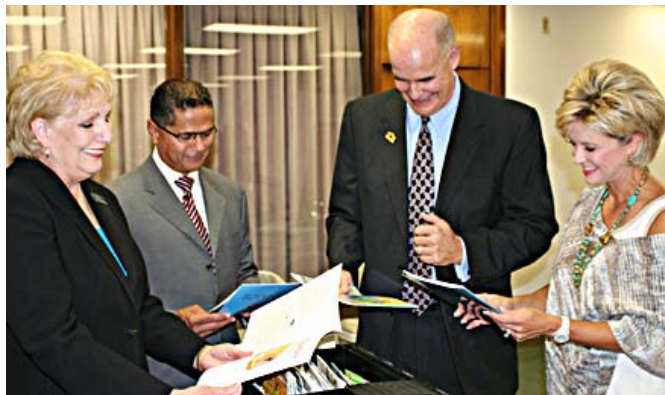
