## SAISD Bond 2010 progress on course for fall 2011

Students and staff at schools throughout the District are seeing the improvements under way through the \$515 million bond program. Among them:

### Alamo Stadium and Convocation Center

Site survey and geotechnical investigation work is in progress. Advertising for the contractor will begin in October.

### Athletic tracks

Work to replace cinder with all-weather tracks is nearing completion at Burbank, Edison, Highlands and Sam Houston. Replacement at the other four high schools is scheduled for next summer so that this year's athletic season will not be disrupted.

### Playgrounds

Completed/and or substantially completed are 24 elementary playgrounds. Work at Mission Academy, Collins Garden, Graebner and Pershing elementaries is in progress, and soon to begin at Lamar.

### Safety and security

- Installation of new security fencing is complete and/or substantially complete at

seven of 68 schools.

- Keycard installation is complete and/or substantially complete at 14 schools and in progress at seven others.
- In progress are security camera proposals on bid packages for schools not receiving major construction.

### Technology upgrades

Twenty-two schools have received new computers. Equipment is on order or en route at 36 others, with delivery scheduled for September and October. In all, 68 schools will receive new computers.

### Transportation/support facilities

The preliminary engineering report and site survey are complete and/or substantially complete, while programming and preliminary design, geotechnical and environmental investigations and user group meetings are in progress.

### Bond community meetings

The second in a series of gatherings to provide further input and learn the latest on the bond program will conclude next week.

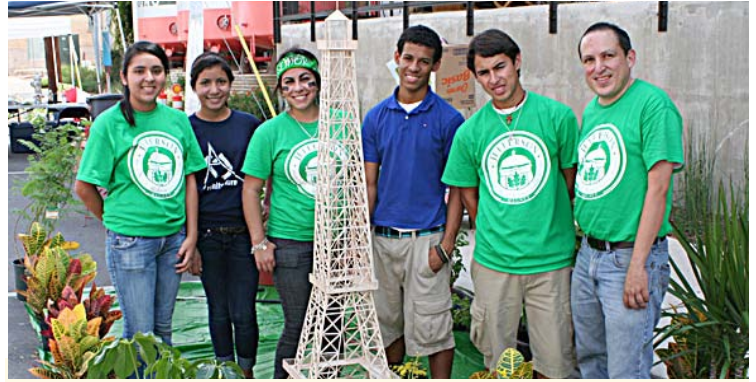


## Gubernatorial appointment
