Dr. Sylvester Perez takes helm as District's interim superintendent

An Alamo City native and 40-year veteran educator returns to his hometown to lead SAISD through the transition to a permanent superintendent.

Dr. Sylvester Perez was selected by Trustees in a special-called March 1 School Board meeting.

"Dr. Perez brings extensive experience and demonstrated leadership, and will serve the District well in this transition," said SAISD Board President Ed Garza.

Prior to joining the University of Texas at Austin as an adjunct professor, Perez served 13 years as a superintendent.

Most recently he headed the Midland ISD,

where he retired in June 2010. He previously was superintendent for the San Marcos Consolidated, Clint and Mathis school districts.

Perez also has held a variety of positions - classroom teacher, coach, athletic director, assistant principal and principal - in several school districts throughout Texas and New Mexico.

Locally, these include Judson, North East, Northside and his own Harlandale, from which he was graduated.

As a student at Harlandale HS, Perez was named to the Express-News All-City High School Baseball Team in 1967.

His post-secondary education was obtained at New Mexico Highlands University where he earned his master's and bachelor's degrees. Perez received his doctorate in educational administration from Texas A&M University.

Additionally, he has earned numerous honors and awards. Among them:

- 2006 Texas Superintendent of the Year finalist
- 2006 Highlands University Hall of Fame inductee
- 2004 San Marcos Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Educator of the Year
- 1999 election (first Hispanic) to the Texas University Interscholastic League Legislative Council
- 1998 Harlandale ISD Hall of Fame inductee

Perez will serve at the will of the School Board until a permanent replacement is named, which is expected to be this summer.

Dr. Robert J. Durón, who had been the District's superintendent since July 2006, resigned Feb. 20.

He has been hired as the Texas Education Agency's deputy commissioner for finance and administration.

And last week a high-ranking Texas official took a trip to Southtown in honor of Teach For America Week. While there Secretary of State Hope Andrade reconnected with TFA teacher David Nungaray, who had extended the invitation to visit his 4th-graders upon meeting her previously in San Antonio.
