Exam Scores

AP Score Reports are sent in July to the college or university you designated on your answer sheet, to you, and to your high school. Each report is cumulative and includes scores for all the AP Exams you have ever taken, unless you have requested that one or more scores be withheld from a college or canceled. Visit [AP Score Reporting Services](#) .

To request that your score reports be sent to colleges, call 888 308-0013 (toll free in the United States and Canada) or 609 771-7366.

Most AP Score Reports are sent by mid-July. Some reports take longer to process because of problems with identification information or the late arrival of materials from the testing location. Contact AP Services if you have not received a score report by September 1.

Subscores are not available (except for Calculus BC and Music Theory) nor are scores analyzed to determine strengths and weaknesses.

Pens with black/dark blue ink for completing areas on exam booklet covers and

free-response questions in most exams. • Your social security # for identification purposes. If you provide it, the # will appear

on your AP Grade Reports. **You should NOT bring the following to the exam:** • Cellular phones, pagers, MP3 players, computers or personal digital assistants (PDAs).

We will hold them during the test in alphabetized large envelopes.

•

Books, compasses, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, rulers or notes.

•

Scratch paper (notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets).

•

Watches that beep or have an alarm

•

Portable listening or recording devices (even with headphones) or photographic equipment.

•

Food or drink –except for your break snacks

• Clothing with subject-related information
