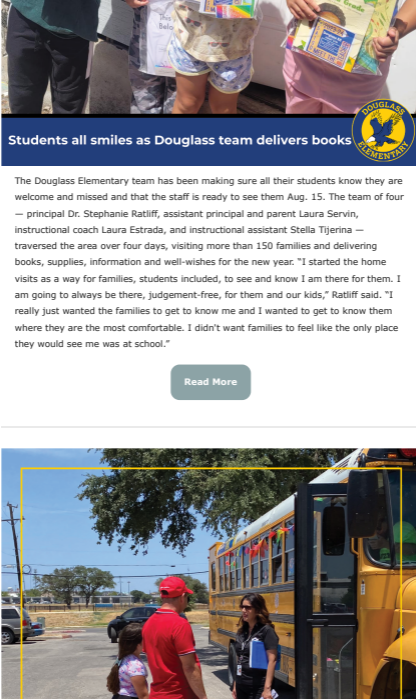

Students all smiles as Douglass team delivers books

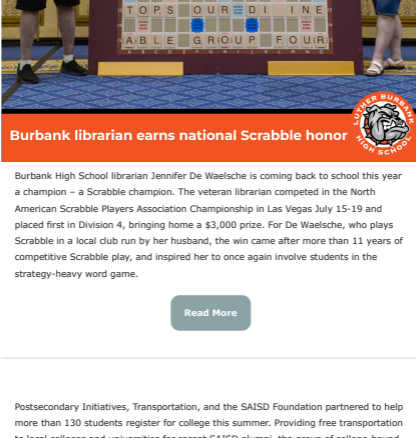

District staff visit homes to help with enrollment

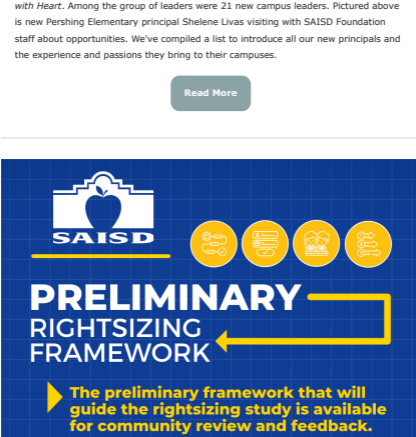

UNESCO-recognized chef joins Brackenridge team

This week was New Teacher Orientation, and SAISD has some amazing new teachers joining the SAISD Familia. Chef John Tamez is joining the culinary teaching team at Brackenridge High School and he also begins his term in the third cohort of UNESCO Chef Ambassadors this month. The local UNESCO Chef Ambassadors program began when San Antonio was named one of two U.S. Creative Cities of Gastronomy as part of UNESCO's Creative Cities Network. The World Heritage Office seeks local chefs to participate in local and international activities that reflect the unique heritage, people, and culture of San Antonio. Tamez is the first public school teacher to receive the designation since the program began. "Being selected as a UNESCO Ambassador provides the distinct opportunity to give exposure to culinary programs across the city, especially SAISD culinary programs," Tamez said. "I am looking forward to involving and showcasing my students, any way I can, with events or demos while being a UNESCO chef."

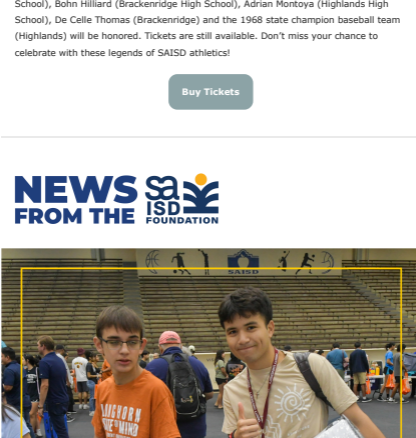
Burbank librarian earns national Scrabble honor

You've likely heard the district is conducting a study to analyze school building capacity for the purpose of supporting thriving schools, classrooms, students, teachers, and school leaders. We are firmly committed to delivering on our promise of a high-quality education for every child, which is outlined in our *Always Learning* strategic management plan. It is important to know that because of the study, we may recommend to our Board of Trustees the consolidation or closure of some schools for the 2024-2025 school year. We want to do better for our children by ensuring each student has the same access to extraordinary educational experiences and resources regardless of the campus where they attend. In the coming weeks, the district will hold 14 public meetings across the district to lay out a draft framework that could guide the district's analysis. Please come to one or more of these meetings! We need your input to develop the best framework possible for an outcome that elevates the educational experiences of our children and the teaching and working experiences for our employees.

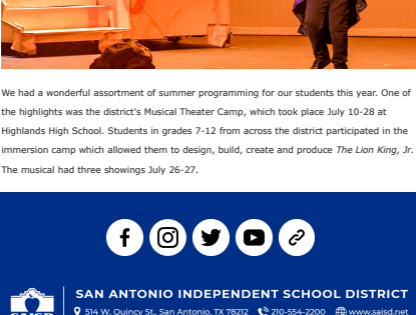
