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San Antonio ISD has announced plans to establish a second all-girls school. SAISD will open a school for primary grades in August of 2019, starting with Kinder and first. The school will add a grade each year, ultimately becoming K-5. YWLA Primary at Page will be open to all girls who live within Bexar County, with priority to those living within the Page MS boundaries. There are no academic entry requirements and admission is based on a lottery system.


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Rhodes scholar visits Travis ECHS

United Way campaign runs Oct. 1-Nov. 2

District employees wanting to contribute to the SAISD Foundation or support local agencies can once again do so through the District's United Way campaign which begins Oct. 1 and runs through Nov. 1. To direct a gift or a portion of a gift to the SAISD Foundation, which directly benefits SAISD schools and students, designate code #8031. There will be \$6,000 worth of grants awarded to schools in the following categories: \$1,000 grants for three schools with the highest percentage of employees who designate a gift to SAISD Foundation (8031); \$500 and \$250 grants for six schools with largest increases in the number of employees who designate a gift to SAISD Foundation (8031), and \$500 grants for two schools with the highest percentage of employees who give to the overall campaign. All employees giving \$20 or more to the Foundation will receive a thank you gift, and those giving over \$100 will receive the Foundation's SAISD Texas T-shirt. The District's goal this year is \$205,000.
