


This fall, San Antonio ISD has partnered with a team of researchers from The University of Texas at Austin in an ambitious, five-year collaboration

aimed to redesign early childhood education in the District. Hands-on, child-centered learning where each child's distinctive capabilities and their linguistic and cultural backgrounds are seen as assets is at the crux of the redesign. Dynamic Innovation for Young Children, or DIFYC for short, puts the child, not the teacher or curriculum, at the center of the classroom and allows children to be active decision-makers in their own education. DIFYC sets the stage for a love of learning in a child's educational journey through high school and beyond. **READ MORE**


TFLA names Vásquez Administrator of the Year Martha Vásquez, SAISD
