These teachers were the first Relay GSE cohort to earn their graduate degrees. 

Gilbert Rivera, head custodian at Highlands HS, demonstrates the effectiveness of a new auto scrubber that the school received this summer. Custodians had been using a traditional mop and bucket to clean the floors, and now with this new technology, a hallway that previously took an hour and a half to clean now only takes about 20 minutes and dries immediately. "This machine is a big help to the District and the school," said Leon Hernandez, a custodian at Highlands. "It really cuts down on time, and the floors look very shiny and clean after use."

According to Juan Valle, the custodian grounds manager for Zone 5 at Highlands, not only does the auto scrubber save the District thousands of dollars in manpower, but because it can both perform the function of a mop as well as a refinisher, the District saves money on the harsh chemicals that are no longer needed to remove wax from the floors. Fifty-six SAISD schools have new auto scrubbers on campus, and custodians received training this summer on how to maintain the machine, which should last seven to ten years.
