### Joaquin Castro visits staff, students at alma mater

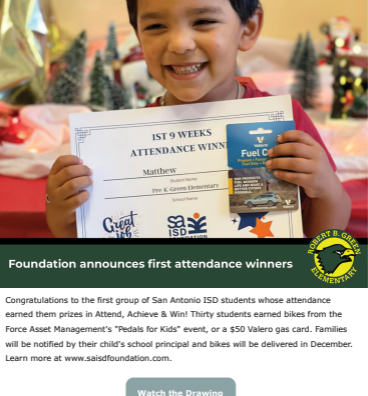

### Mock election enhances social studies lessons

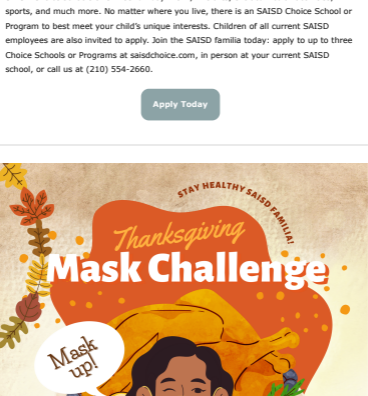

### UT brings distinguished alumnus to UT Aquí

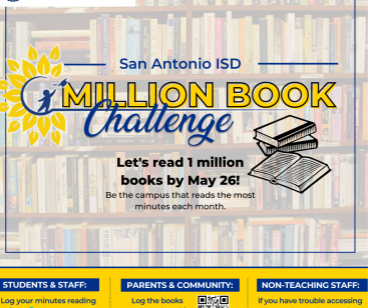
Nearly 100 students from schools around the district attended UT Aquí, a University of Texas at Austin College Fair, at Highlands High School on Nov. 3. Working with Postsecondary Initiatives, UT brought representatives from nine of its academic colleges to interact with students and parents. Throughout the evening, speakers from the district and the university spoke to students about stretching themselves academically and not letting fear hold them back from applying to dream colleges. The keynote speaker for the event was Col. Leon Holland, a 1956 graduate of Wheatley High School and one of the first Black undergraduate students admitted to the University of Texas in Fall 1956. "During our life's journey, we will encounter opportunities," Holland told the students. "We need to make sure we recognize those opportunities. We will also encounter obstacles and challenges. We need to navigate through those difficult times. There will be struggles. That's when we have to learn that perseverance is critical."



### JROTC, LOTC instructors build tomorrow's leaders
