During non-school hours, the general public will have free access to library resources and technology.

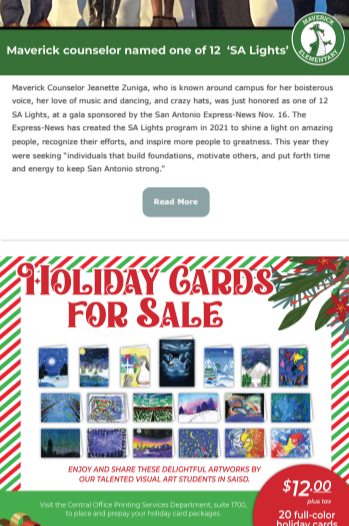

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### Travis instructor receives U. of Chicago award

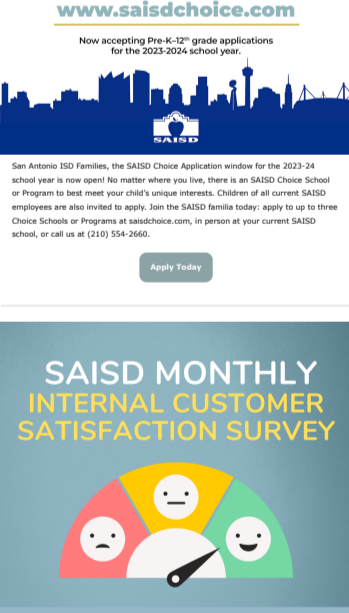

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### Families dive into technology at STEM Nights

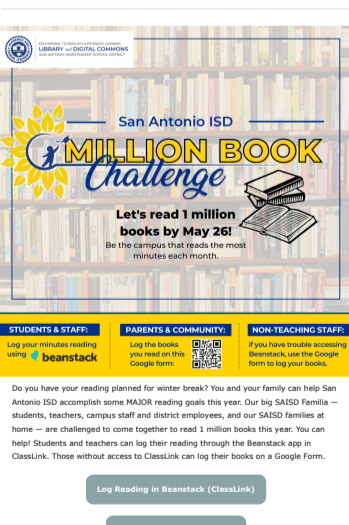
