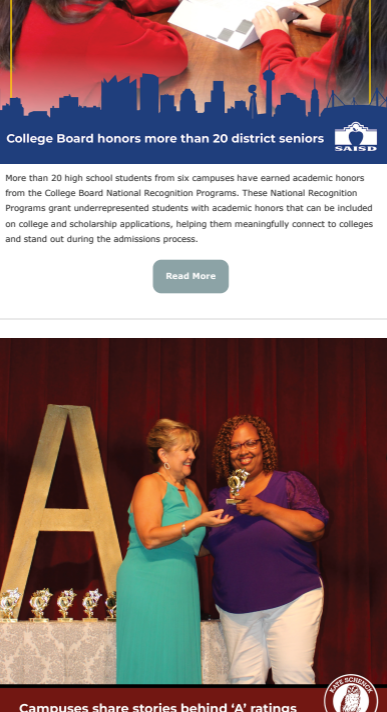


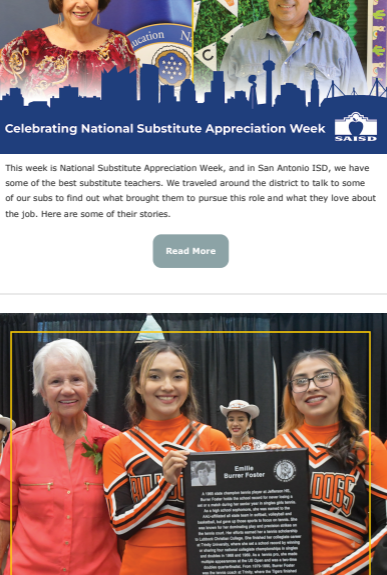

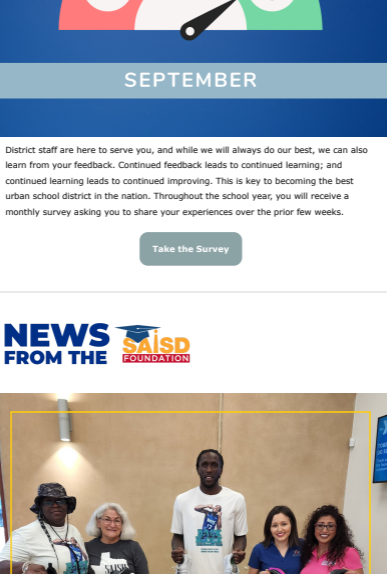

### MASTER TEACHER INITIATIVE 3.0

The Master Teacher Initiative (MTI) is a district initiative to develop, support, recognize, retain, and reward excellent teaching. The newly TEA-TIA approved MTI 3.0 model expands the current plan to include teachers that are not assigned to STAAR/EOC tested courses. "The Office of Continuous Improvement is excited to announce the expansion of the Master Teacher Initiative 3.0 that will allow almost all teachers to be eligible for possible designation," Tyler Shoemith, senior executive director of the Office of Continuous Improvement, said. "This has been a collaborative effort to create customized pathways for designation. With this expansion, we are dedicated to ensuring that we have clear communication, valid and reliable systems and serve a supportive role in the designation process. We know that teachers have faced incredible challenges over the last few years and this opportunity to recognize their efforts is most appropriately timed."

### NBA Player Prince donates 61 Pairs of athletic shoes

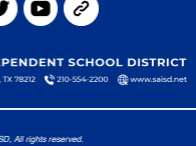
