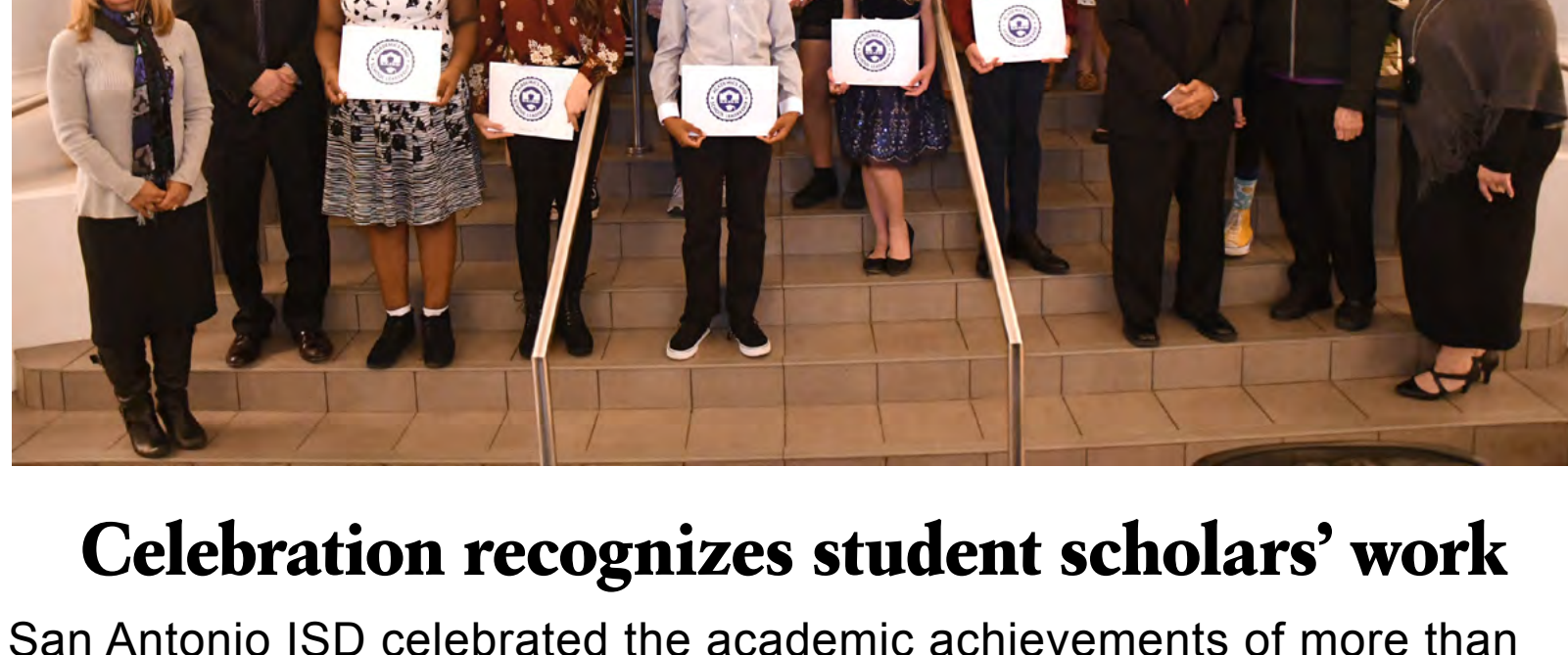

Construction progressing on new administration building

In early 2021, more than 600 San Antonio ISD employees will relocate to a new, consolidated administration building located on North Flores Street adjacent to the Fox Tech High School campus. The approximately 140,000 square foot Central Administration Building will incorporate 15,000 square feet of conference room space, which includes a board room as well as various conference rooms scattered throughout the entire building. Additionally, there will be 6,500 square feet of dining space and a 2,150 square foot fitness center.

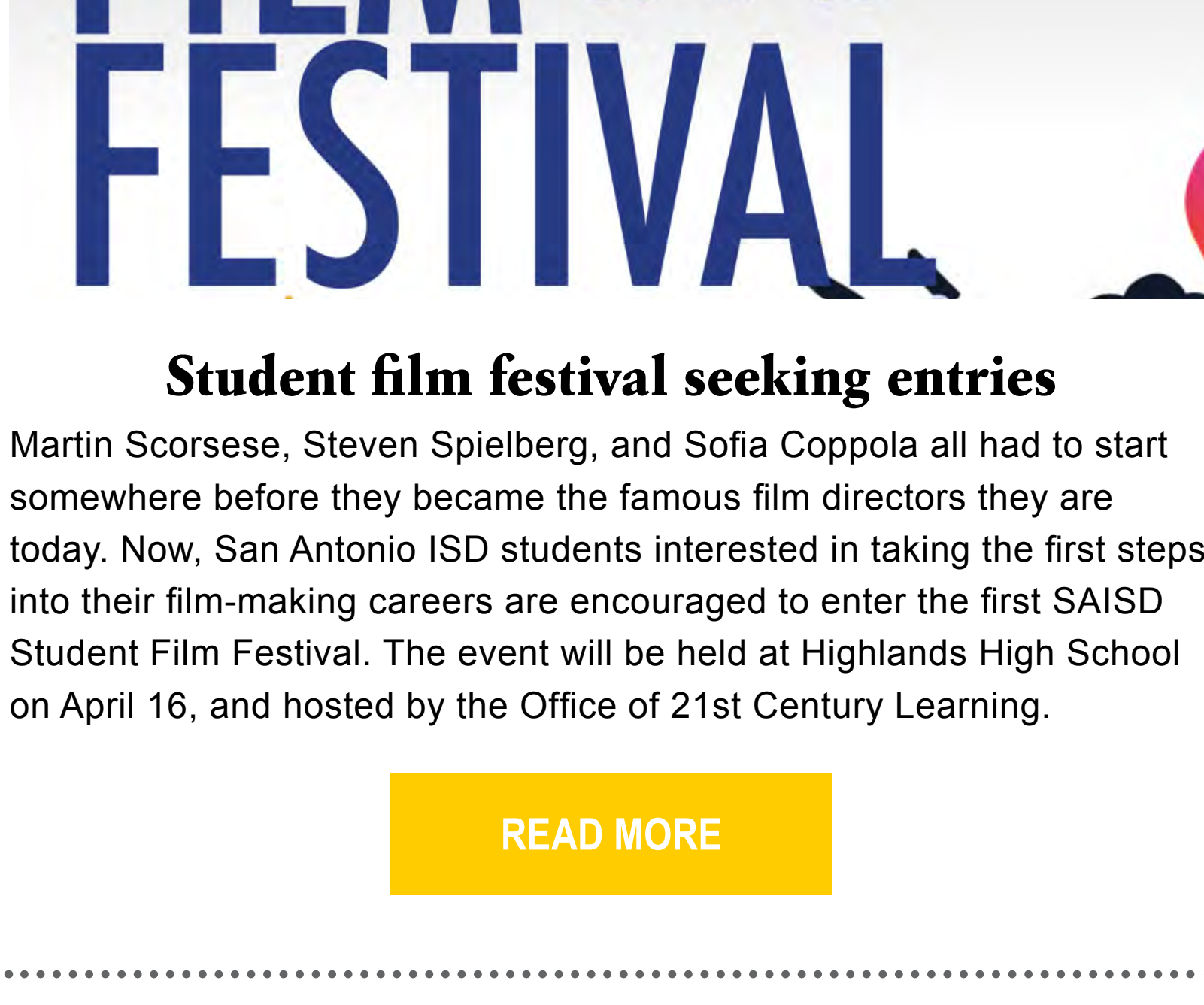

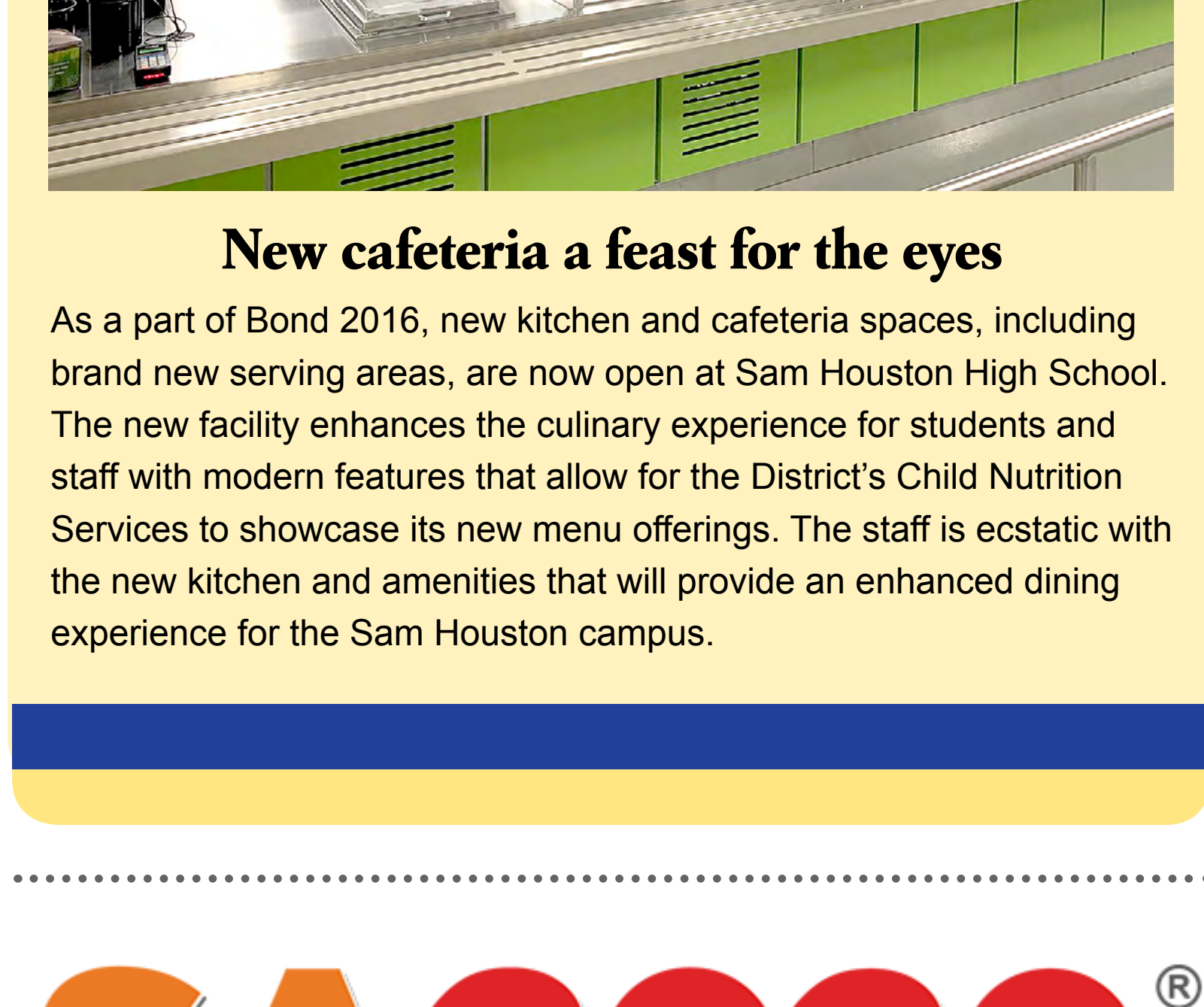
