

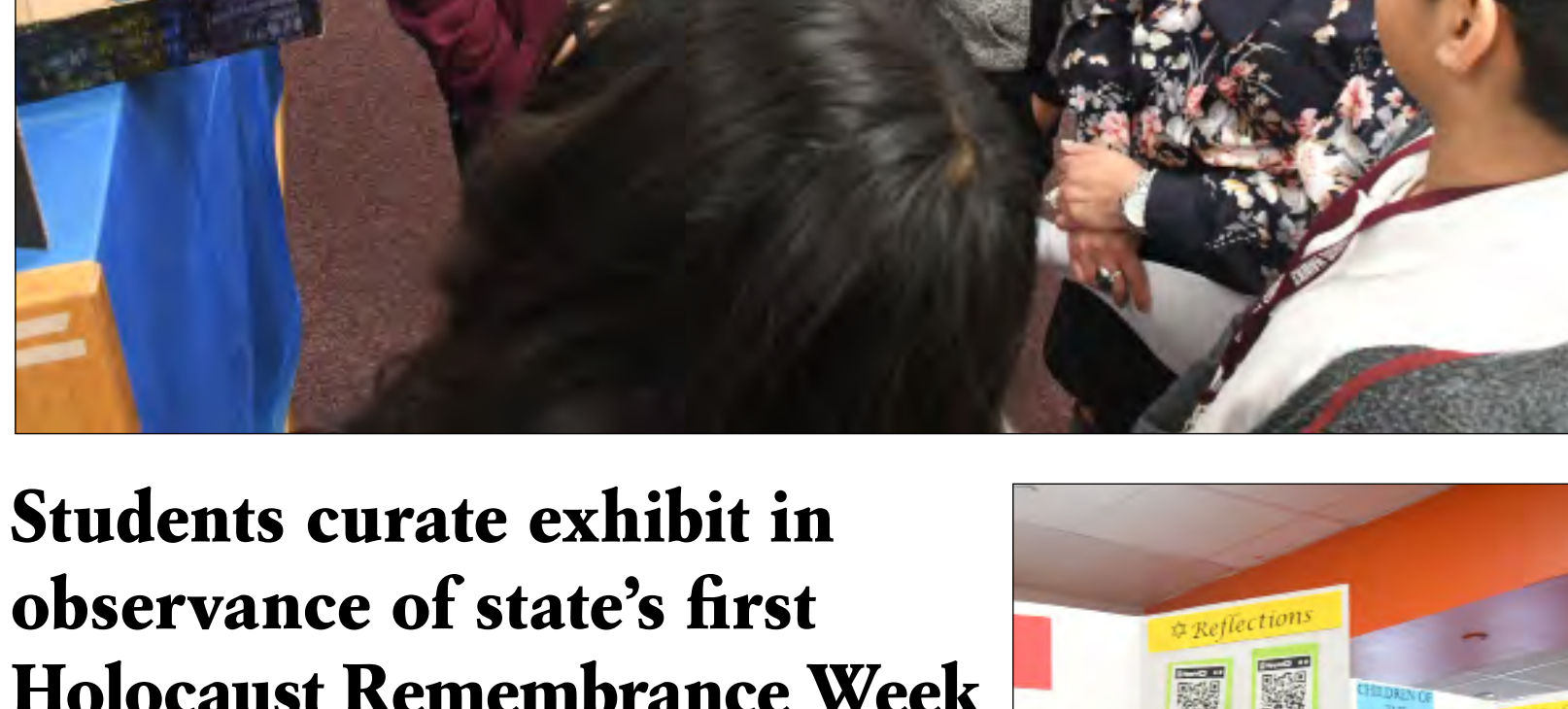

### College Board recognizes SAISD counselors

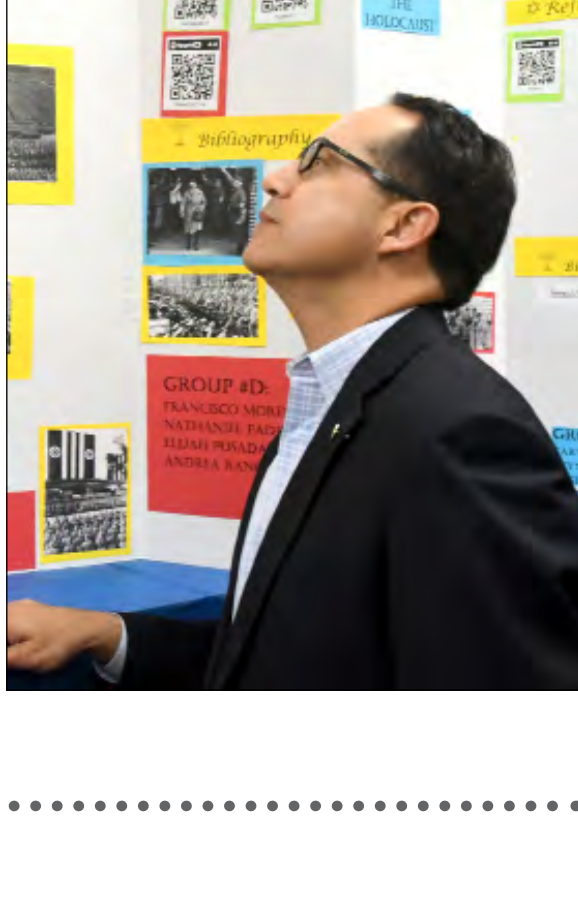

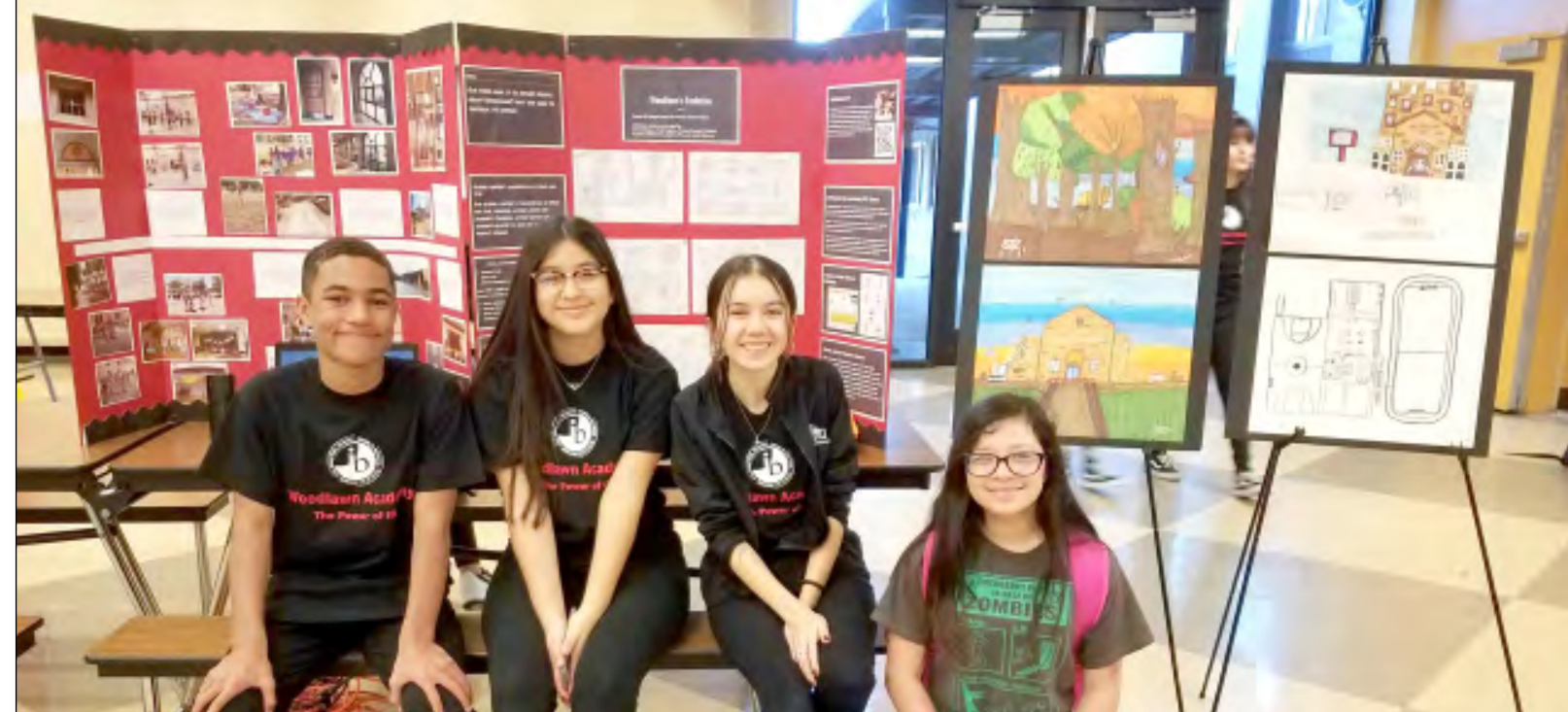


### Students curate exhibit in observance of state's first Holocaust Remembrance Week

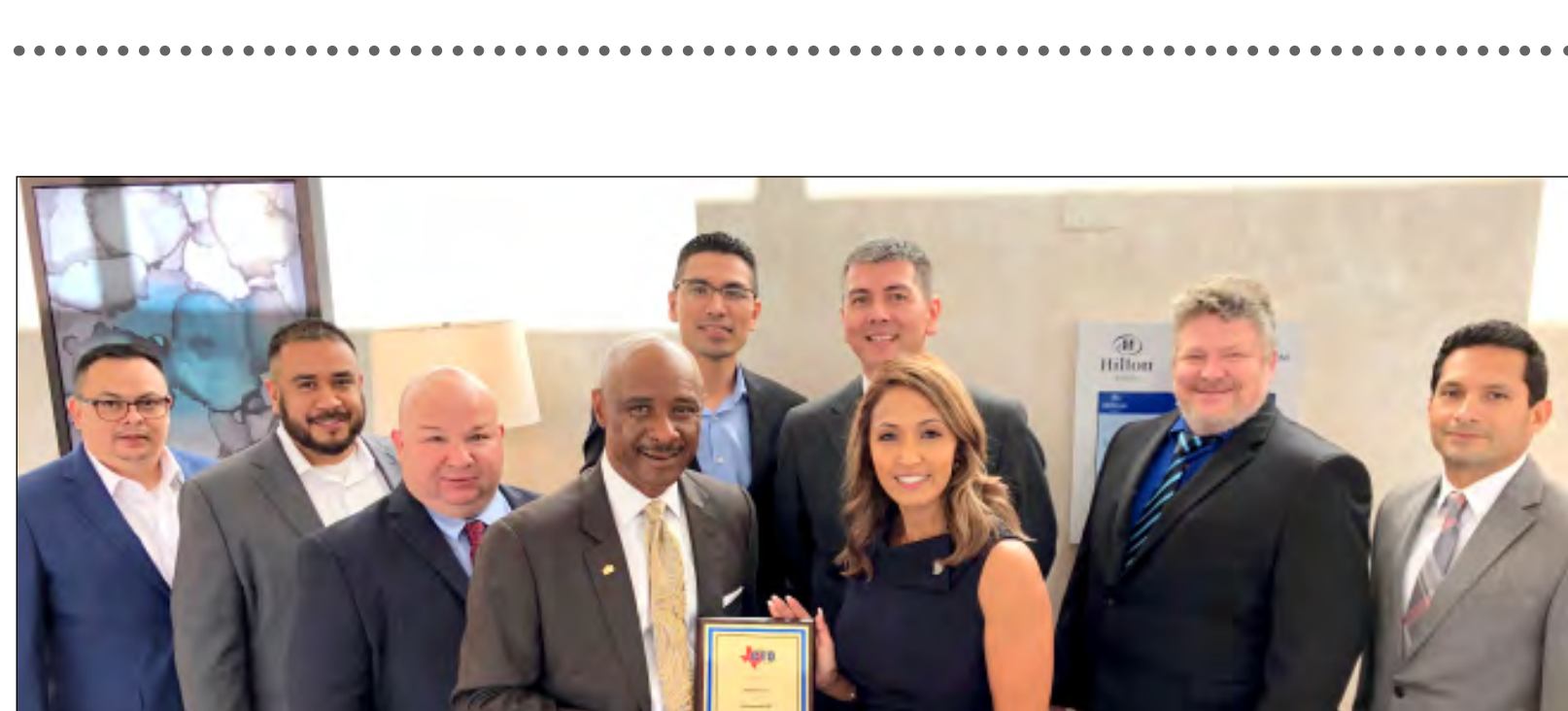

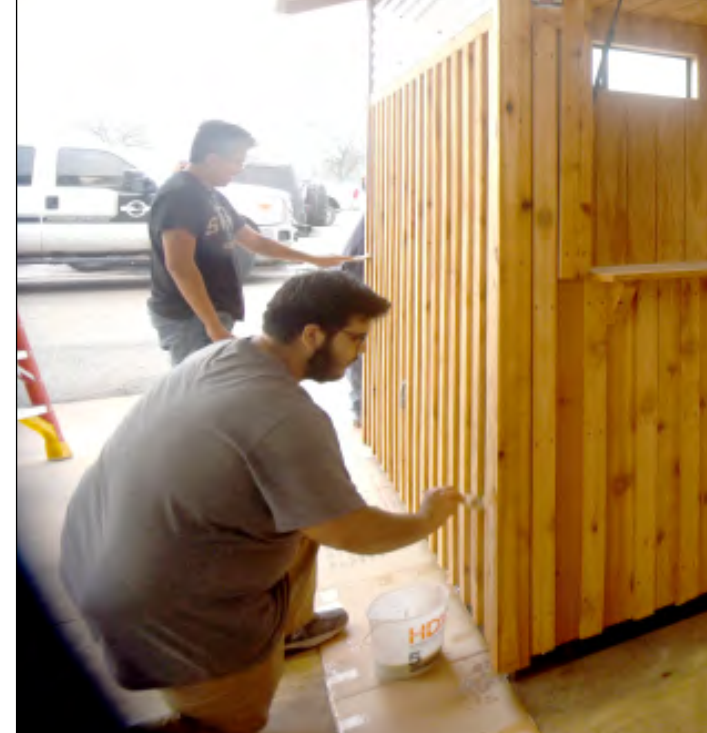
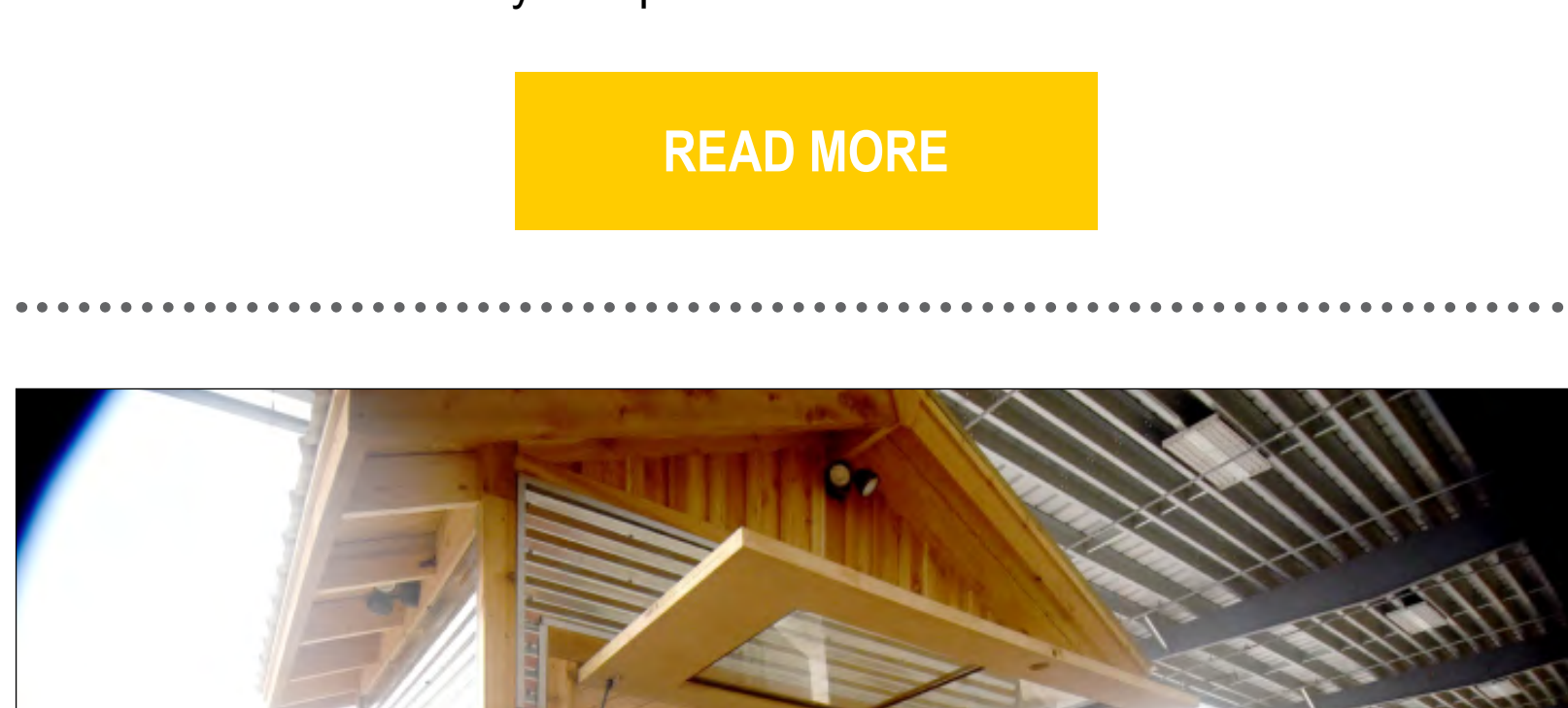

### Statewide honor awarded to SAISD technology leadership team

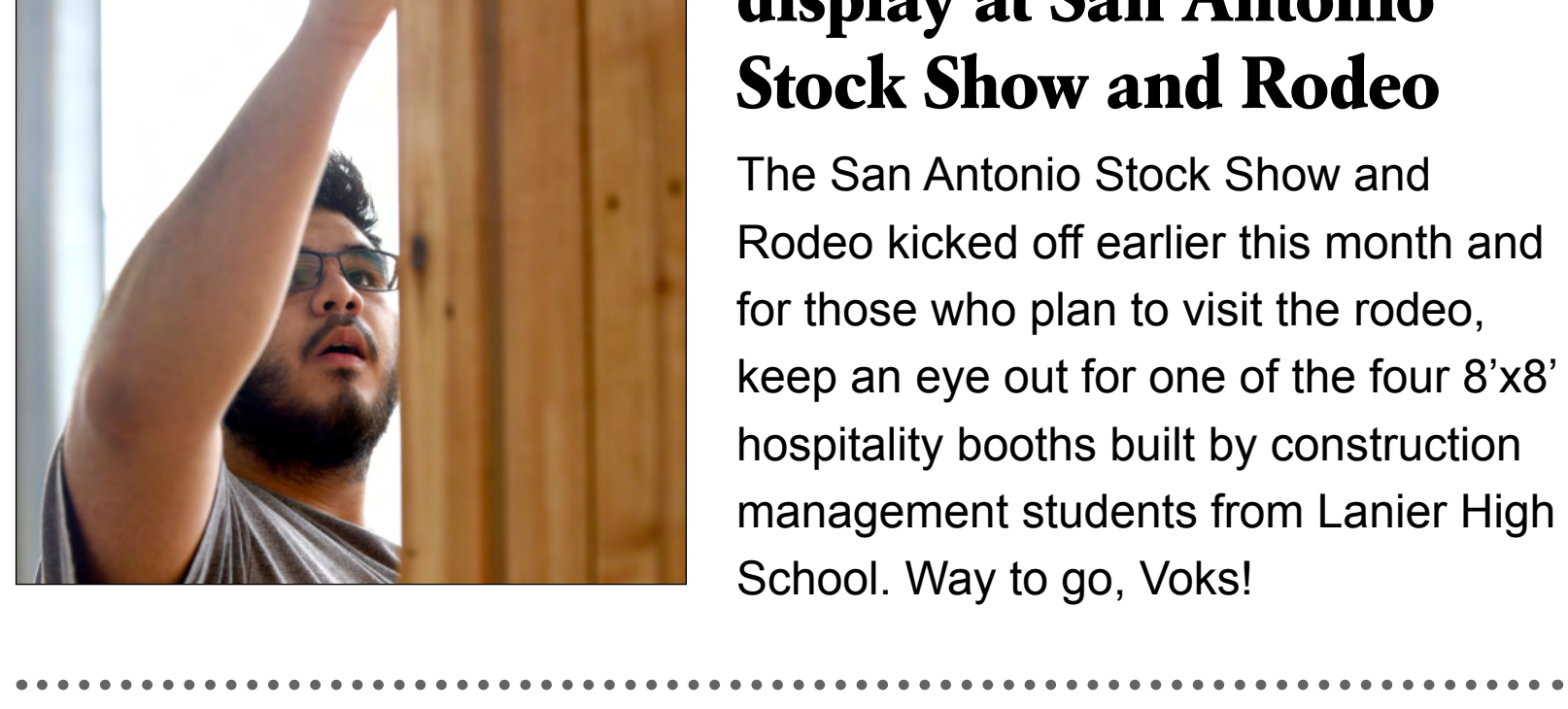

### Lanier students' work on display at San Antonio Stock Show and Rodeo

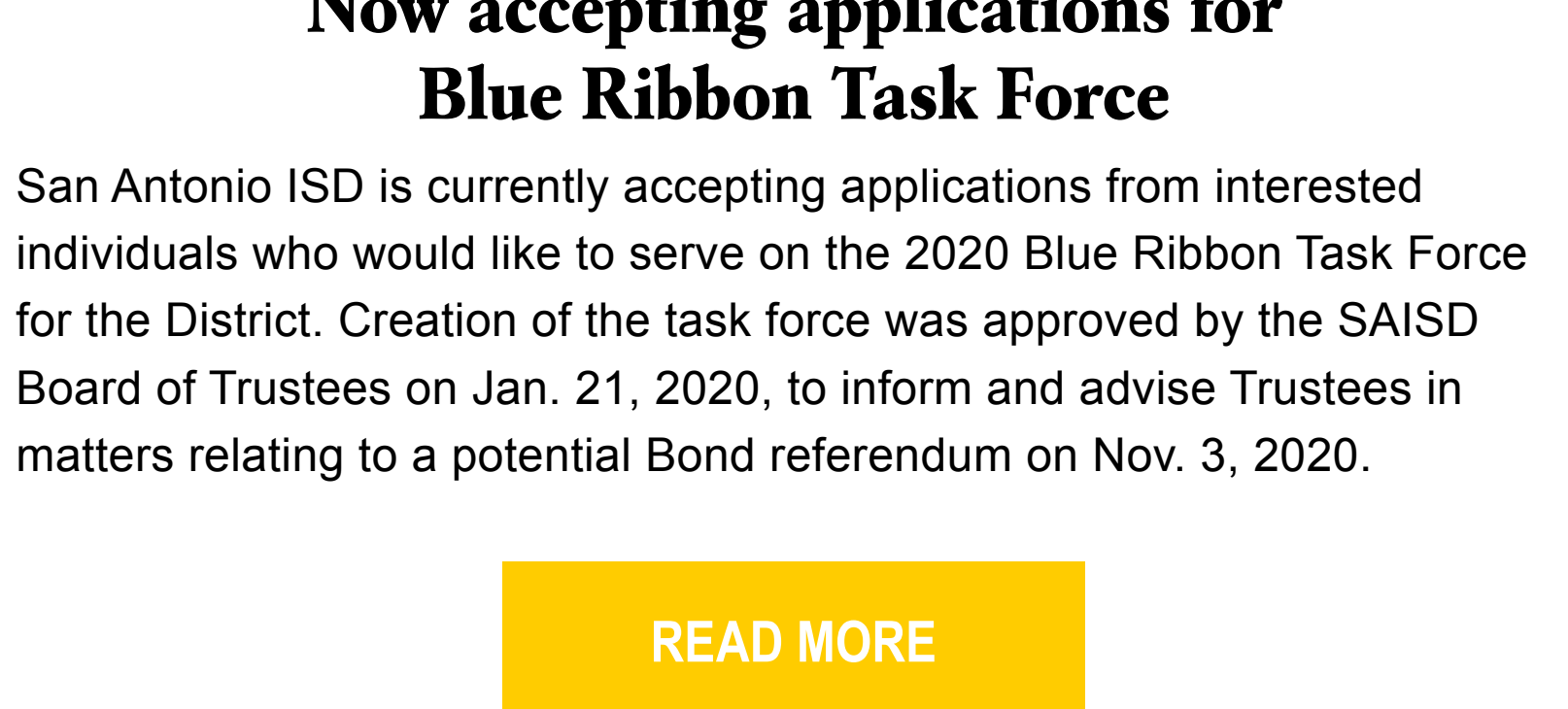

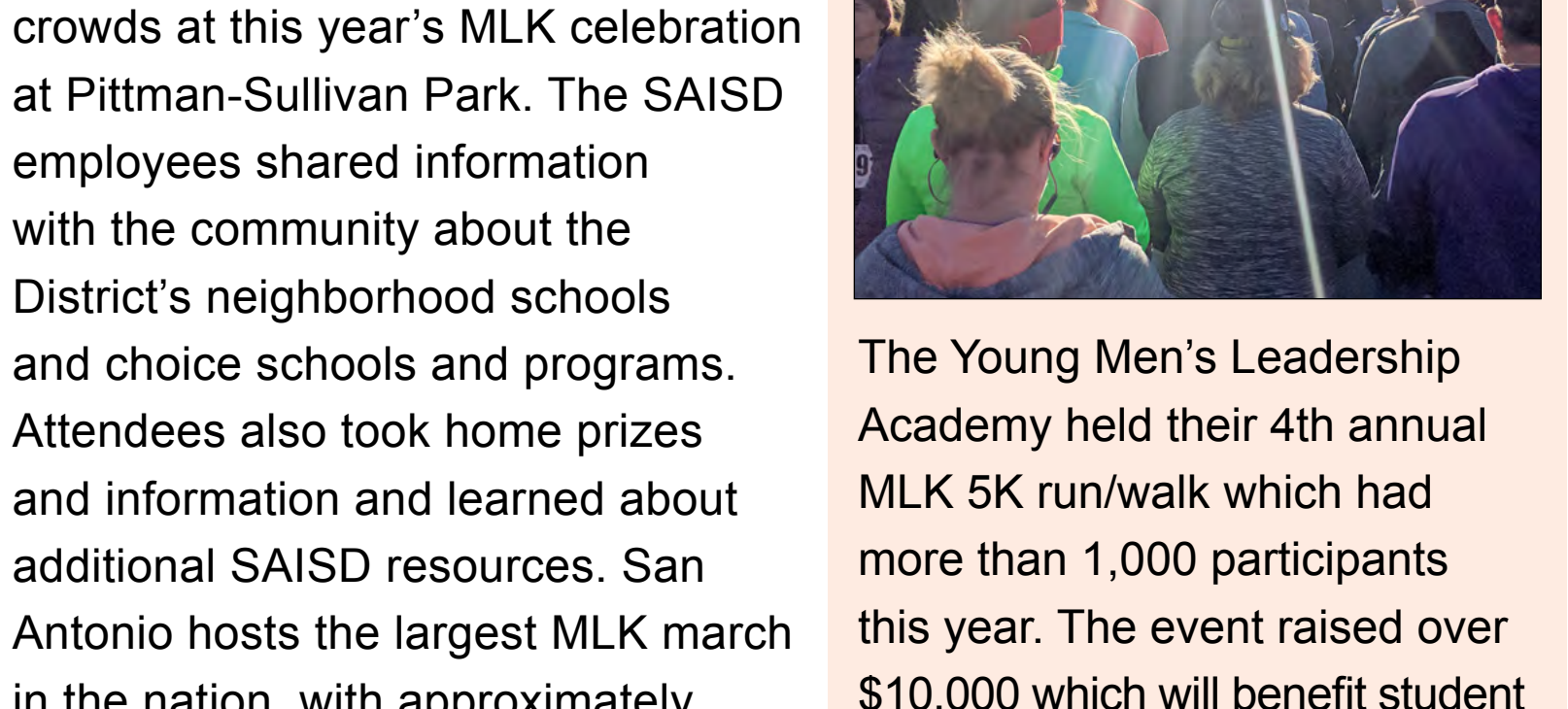


### Celebrating MLK Day

SAISD's Office of Innovation and Office of Access and Enrollment services joined the enthusiastic crowds at this year's MLK celebration at Pittman-Sullivan Park.
