
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### YWLA nominated by state for 2021 National **Blue Ribbon honors**


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#### **Burroughs recognized** as best in Texas


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#### J.T. Brackenridge Elementary nearing completion under Bond 2016

### **Travis ECHS students testing out college** experience with SAC Honors Academy

Travis Early College High School students are receiving a unique experience that no one else in the city is getting: to try out an honors college without the stress or hardship of final exams and college tuition. For the first time, partnering with San Antonio College, the Travis students are part of a cohort pilot called SAC Honors Academy that the college is hoping to broaden later this year. A total of seven Travis sophomores are taking part after meeting high eligibility requirements of at least an 85-grade point average and receiving recommendations from their counselors.

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Students show off their interests with **IB** Personal Projects

Earlier this month, 179 Jefferson High School International Baccalaureate sophomores presented their Personal Projects, a student-centered and age-appropriate practical exploration in which students consolidate their learning. This long-term project is designed as an independent learning experience of approximately 25 hours and formally assesses students' Approaches to Learning (ATL) skills for selfmanagement, research, communication, critical and creative thinking, and collaboration. The Personal Project is an annual requirement at every authorized IB school around the world for all sophomores. "We were thoroughly impressed with the products that our students produced given the current worldly conditions," said Jennifer Love, International Baccalaureate MYP coordinator. "We look forward to supporting our fellow "IB sister" school, Burbank High School, as their exhibition will be next month upon our return from Spring Break."

Community Labs provided COVID testing to SAISD students and staff at SAISD's high school campuses and Burnet Learning Center this past weekend. SAISD normally provides weekly testing at 94 SAISD campuses and central offices, but because of last week's winter storms, schools were closed and testing suspended. Thousands of SAISD staff and students took advantage of Saturday's testing. Because Community Labs

uses highly sensitive PCR tests and returns results within 24 hours, COVID-19-negative students and staff could confidently return to school and work on Monday, knowing they were keeping themselves and others safe.
