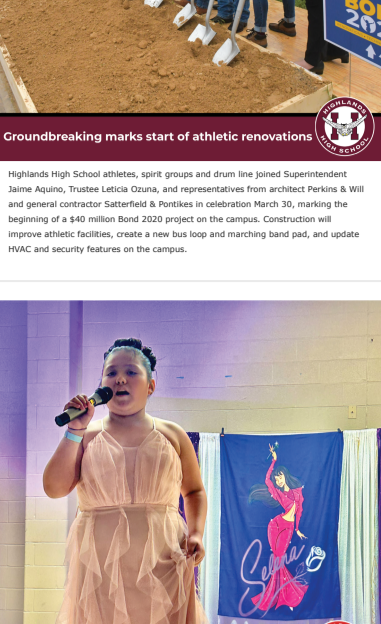

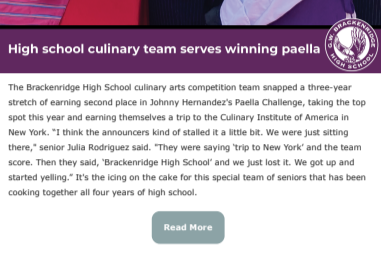
Groundbreaking marks start of athletic renovations

Highlands High School athletes, spirit groups and drum line joined Superintendent Jaime Aquino, Trustee Leticia Ozuna, and representatives from architect Perkins & Will and general contractor Satterfield & Pontikes in celebration March 30, marking the beginning of a \$40 million Bond 2020 project on the campus. Construction will improve athletic facilities, create a new bus loop and marching band pad, and update HVAC and security features on the campus.



Selena Talent Show honors late Latina superstar

Students at Woodrow Wilson Elementary came together last week to celebrate the life of Selena with their inaugural Selena Talent Show. The event coincided with the 28th anniversary of the singer's death, but it was an evening of joy as students and staff sang, danced, and performed ballet folklorico for the community. In total, 12 students (including a father/son duo) and five staff members, including principal Dr. Jennifer Zavala, FACE specialist Rosa Narvaez, a teacher, a crossing guard, and the school's head custodian participated. "As we were coming to the end of Women's History Month and the anniversary of Selena's death, we wanted to celebrate her life," Narvaez said. "The response was amazing. Talent shows and special performances give parents an opportunity to see their children's talent showcased."



District discusses largest pay increase in 25 years

The San Antonio ISD Board of Trustees discussed staff compensation during its budget workshop March 27. On the table is the single largest salary increase – in absolute dollars – the district has offered its staff in 25 years. The compensation initiative recommended for next school year will total almost \$20 million, and more than half of this allotment will benefit teachers. The recommended compensation package makes adjustments to the compensation scales for career teachers and classified workers who historically have been underpaid. It also introduces stipends for math teachers, speech and language instructors, and hard-to-staff schools. The SAISD Board of Trustees will vote on the final staff compensation package at its April 17 meeting.

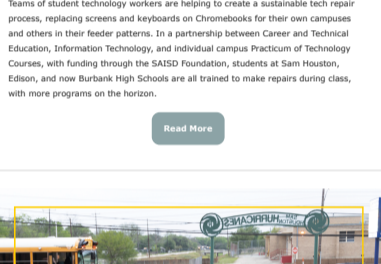
