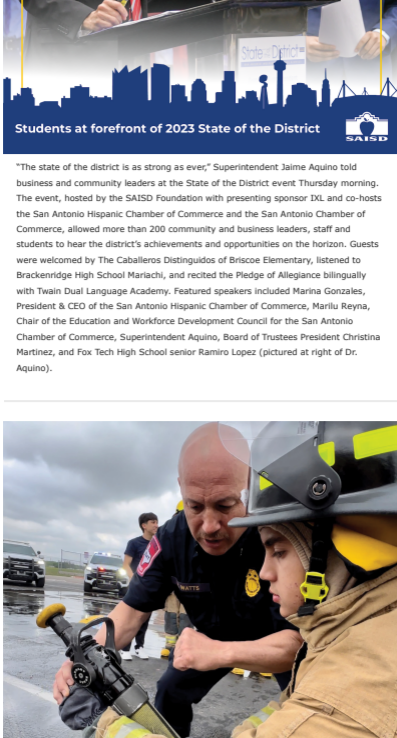
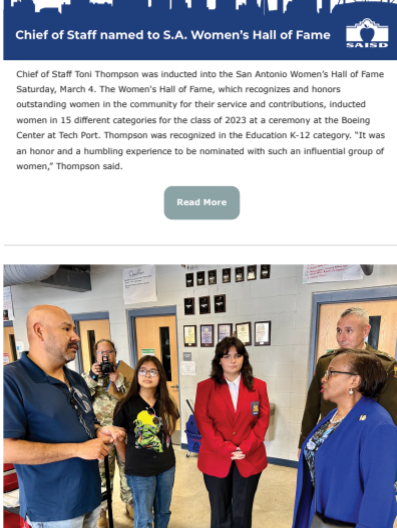

Magnet students train for emergency situations

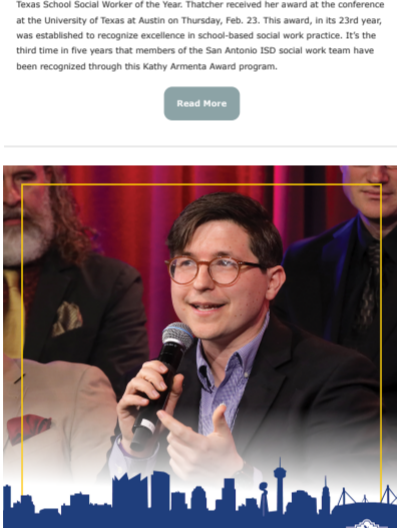

During the drill, Edison's EMT and other health science students treated and conducted triage of victims and took them to appropriate transport vehicles. Edison's fire students flowed water to extinguish a mock fire, and law enforcement students conducted an investigation and made an arrest. Emergency personnel from Acadian Ambulance, Bexar County Sheriff's Office and San Antonio Fire Department were on site to evaluate students' performance and provide feedback for this valuable hands-on learning experience.

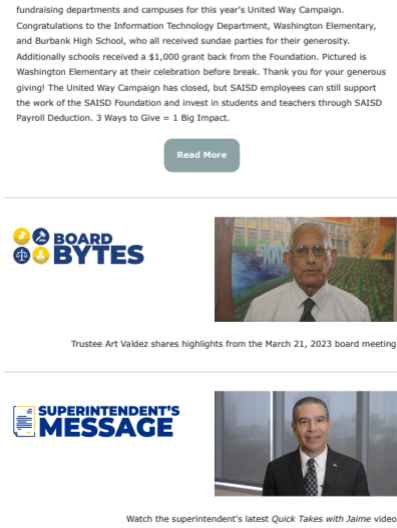
