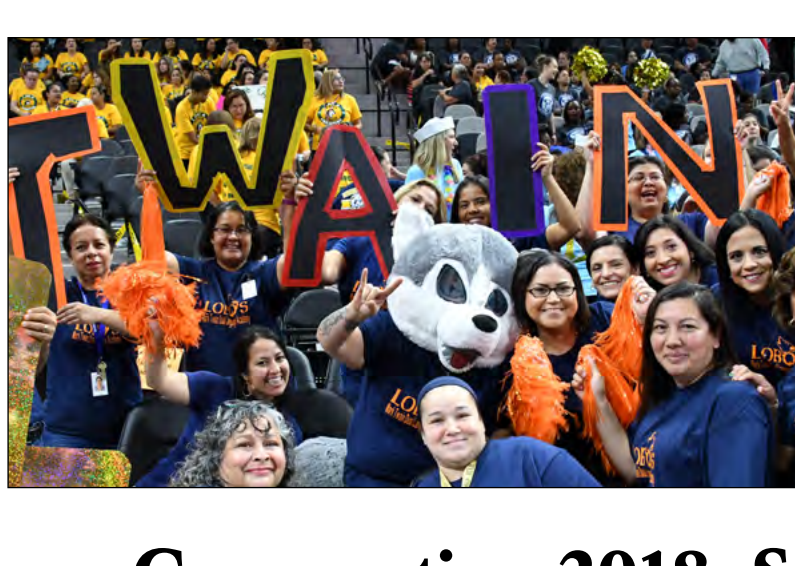
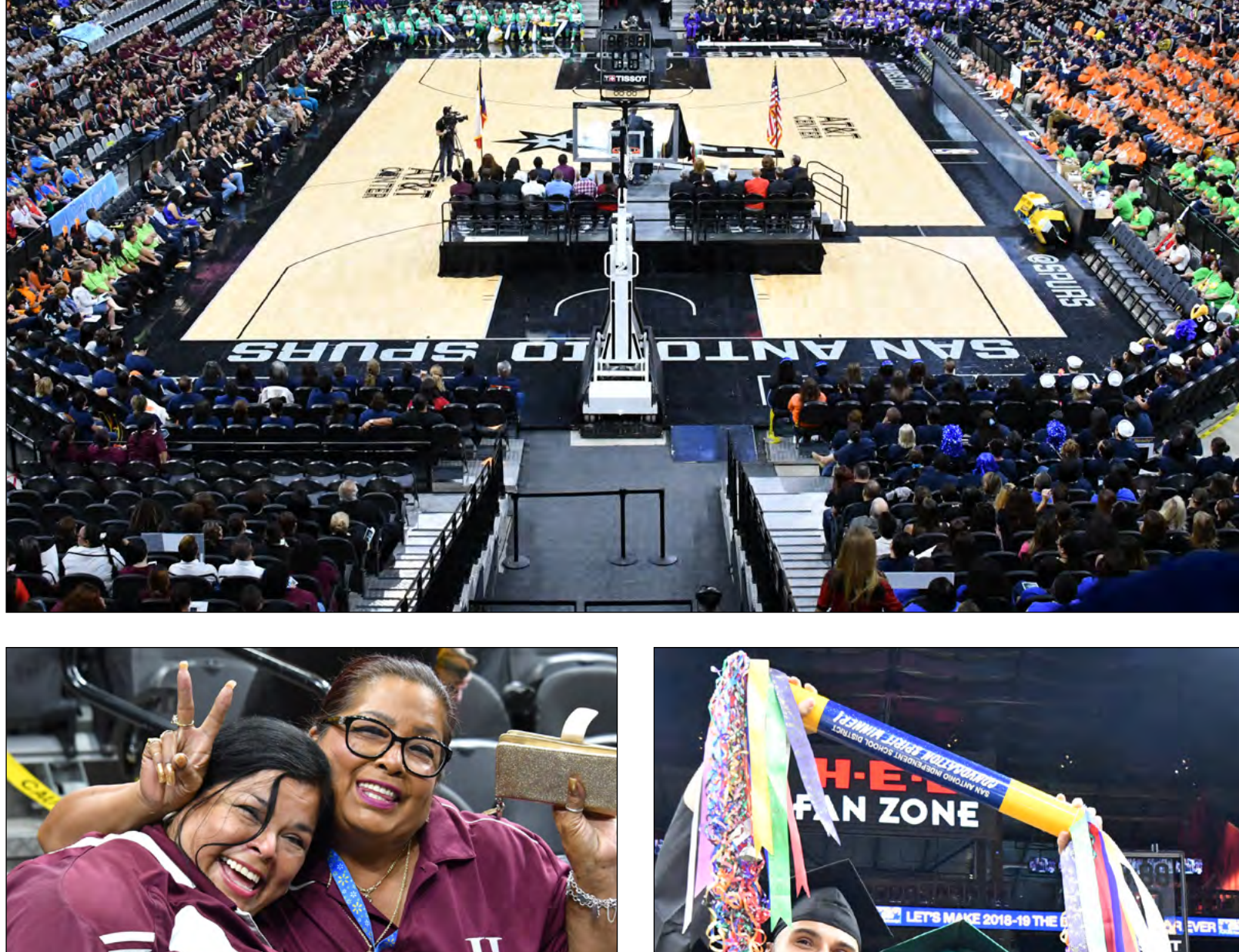

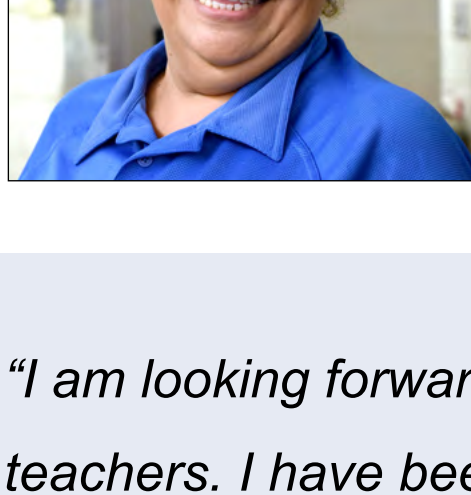
Convocation 2018: SAISD is Future Ready!

“What are you looking forward to most about the new school year?”

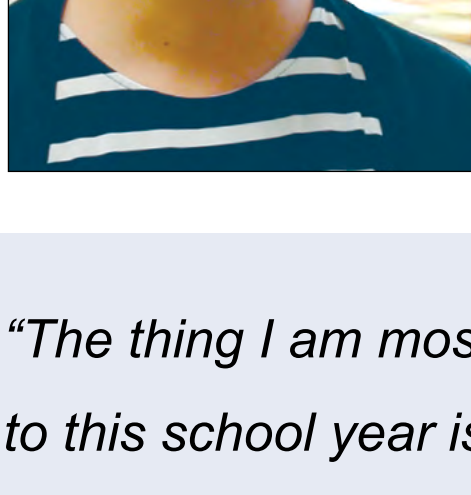
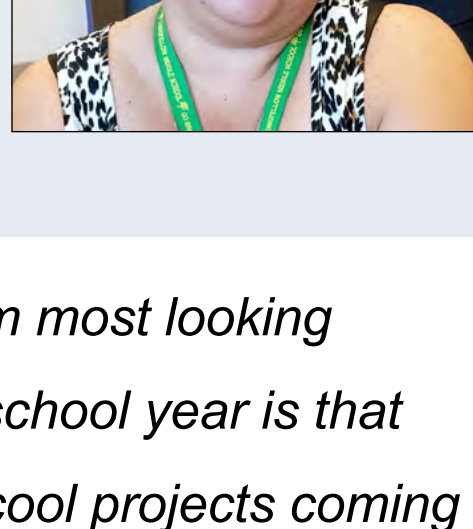


I am looking forward to the students returning, seeing their smiles, and working with them. My favorite thing about my job is the kids; I am here serve them.

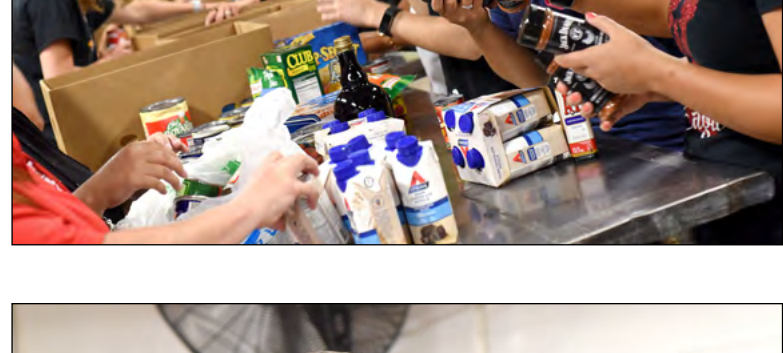
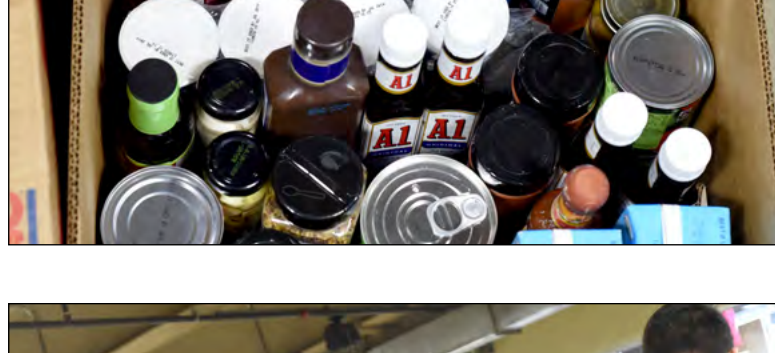
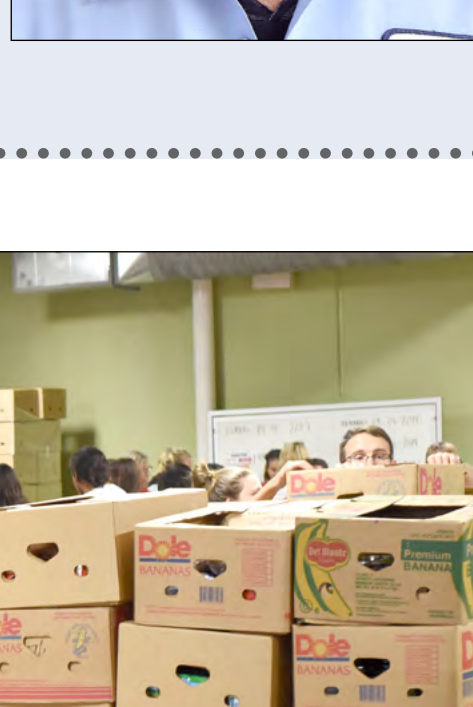


“One of the things I am most looking forward to about this school year is that we have some really cool projects coming up for our project-based learning units. I am really excited to explore those.”
