Gonzalez Convention Center on Saturday, Feb. 15 at 7:30 p.m. He is one of the top mariachi violin players in the state of Texas, and the only SAISD music student selected to the TMEA state convention this year. San Antonio ISD received official notice from the Texas Education Agency (TEA) that our 2024-25 Teacher Incentive Allotment (TIA) designations submitted based on 2023-24 teacher effectiveness data have been approved. As a result, 197 teachers in San Antonio ISD will be designated at the Recognized, Exemplary, or Master level as part of the TIA. These new designations will generate an additional \$2 million through the TIA for teacher compensation. With this designation, they will receive stipendis ranging from \$3,000 to \$26,000, based: their designation level and their school's allotment from the TEA, which is based on campus demographics. This year, the district is adding 46 Recognized Teachers, 104 Exemplary Teachers, and 47 Master Teachers to Its rosters. Since the first cohort was approved in Spring of 2021, SAISD has designated a total of 730 teachers. Teachers will be officially notified by TEA in May with stipends to begin in the 2025-2026 school year. Congratulations! nd 47

San Antonio ISD officially joined the U.S. Defense Department's Spouse Education and Career Opportunities program, the Military Spouse Employment Partnership. Dr. James Harrell, Chief Human Capital Management Officer, officially signed the agreement at a ceremony in Crystal City, Virginia last month. SAISD is one of more than 850 employers dedicated to recruiting, hiring, promoting and retaining military spouses in meaningful careers. Officially beginning its hiring in the program in Fall 2024, SAISD is currently the only K-12 school district in the partnership in Texas and one of only four nationwide. "SAISD is proud to be part of this important initiative and is excited to contribute to the empowerment and support of military spouses and service members in the SAISD Familia, and we are grateful for their service and sacrifice."



Mariana Moran was part of the inaugural graduating class of the high school dual language program at Brackenridge High School in 2022. Moran, who also received dual language education at Bonham Academy, took the AP Spanish exam in eighth grade and earned a 4 out of 5, meaning she is "Well Qualified" in the subject. Her participation in the Early College program at Brackenridge propelled her to finish her undergraduate degree in just over two years. Now a graduate of UTSA, she has come back to SAISD to serve as a substitute teacher with hopes to eventually become a dual language teacher in the district.

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San Antonio ISD sustainability efforts continue to pay off for our students. The district received its latest rebate check from CPS Energy on Wednesday. This year's rebate, \$325,733.58, is the result of energy savings from both equipment updates and demand response. The Energy & Sustainability division was started in 2017. Since then, SAISD has seen over \$2.9 million worth of energy rebates for the district — all the while continuing to protect the environment for future generations to enjoy.
