Are you a student that qualifies for services?	 If you temporarily live: in a shelter, transitional shelter, motel campground, abandoned in a hospital, or awaiting foster care, in a car, park, public place, bus, train or abandoned building, in doubled up situations with friends or relatives because you cannot find or afford housing., or with an adult who is not a parent or guardian, or with your friends.
What are your rights based on this law?	 Immediate enrollment even if you don't have required documents like ID, proof of address, immunizations, birth certificate, social security card and other items. School selection Transportation services Cannot be separated from the general population of students due to their housing situation.
School Enrollment:	• You must be enrolled within two days even if documentation is not available.
School Selection:	You have the right to school selection. You may choose from the following:a) The school that you attended before you lost your home or the last school you were enrolled (school of origin); orb) The school in which you are temporarily residing.
Enrollment Dispute:	 If your decision of school enrollment/selection is not granted, you may initiate the dispute resolution process. You must be provided with a written explanation by the campus of the school's decision (F1-J), including the right to appeal. You must be referred to the Transitions Program for assistance. Pending the resolution of the dispute, you must be immediately enrolled to the school in which you are seeking enrollment If you are an unaccompanied youth (not living with parent or guardian), the same dispute process is applicable.
Transportation:	 Students who are eligible for transportation are those that live 2 or more miles away from the school of origin. VIA bus tickets will be provided to you for school attendance until the school bus schedule is available. VIA semester passes are available to you if you are able to navigate the metro system on your own.
Important information:	Each campus has a Contact Person who can provide assistance to all eligible students.If you are an unaccompanied youth (not living with a parent or guardian) you can enroll yourself.
