4 FIND & ADVOCATE FOR SCHOLARSHIPS & FINANCIAL SUPPORT



Keep track share scholarships that don't require citizenship or residency status with students

5 BUILD YOUR OWN EDUCATOR NETWORK



Build relationships and collaborate with other educators who are supportive of undocumented students at your school or district

6 CONNECT STUDENTS TO UNDOCUMENTED



Attend immigration related events and build a network of undocumented student leaders

7 INVOLVE PARENTS



Share information and resources with parents by distributing Know Your Rights card (order for free at immi.org/order), emergency plans (immi.org/home/make a plan), and college-access information

8 ACCESS REPUTABLE LEGAL INFORMATION **ASSISTANCE**



Use immi.org to find reputable, affordable legal service providers in your area

9 BUILD AGENCY & POWER



Inform students about their rights and share how other immigrant groups have organizing and changing the status quo

10 CREATE SPACES FOR STORYTELLING & CREATIVE EXPRESSION



Encourage students to build their own meaning and sense of identity that is different from the negative stigma and stereotypes about undocumented immigrants
