Key Academic Vocabulary

- Closed syllable words: words that end with a consonant(s) that "closes in" the vowel, so the vowel makes the short sound (ex: cat, dog)
- Open syllable words: words that end with a vowel (ex: he, be, we)
- Retelling: recalling the key ideas and supporting details in a logical order
- Inference: a conclusion drawn from using what you know and evidence from the text
