- Why did economic differences between the regions of the United States continue to develop during this era?
- What was the effects of the attempt to maintain the balance of free and slave states in Congress?

Key Academic Vocabulary

- Sectionalism- the differences over slavery and in social and economic structure resulted in ongoing conflict betwee the North and South prior to the Civil War
- Compromise- an agreement or settlement that is reached by each side giving up something
- Tariff- a tax paid on imports or exports

- Secession- when a region, state, or territory removes attempts to remove itself from a country
- Reconstruction- the effort to reintegrate the Confederate states after the Civil War
- Emancipation-freeing enslaved people
