Key Academic Vocabulary

- Deregulation- the removal of government restrictions on business to promote economic growth
- Environmentalism- the movement to promote the protection of the environment that was a response to several disasters in the 1960s and 1970s
- Stagflation- when the economy is experiencing both rising inflation and high unemployment

- Free trade agreement- a treaty between countries to reduce or remove barriers to international trade like quotas and tariffs
- Impeachment- to charge a public official with a crime or misconduct
