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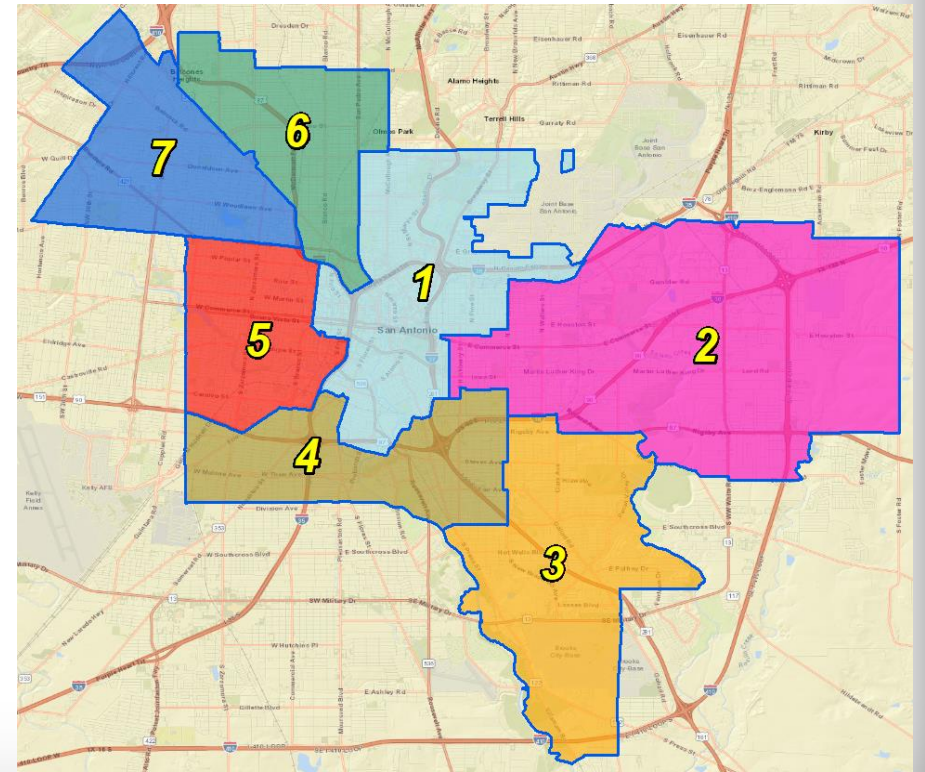

What is redistricting?

- The process by which the geographic boundaries of elective districts (such as school board single member districts) are periodically redrawn in response to changes in population.

San Antonio ISD Governance

- SAISD is governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of seven members who are elected to four-year terms by voters in their single member districts.
- SAISD Trustee elections are held in May of odd-numbered years.



Why is SAISD redistricting?

- Texas Education Code requires a school board to re-divide single member districts if “*census data indicates that the population of the most populous district exceeds the population of the least populous district by more than 10 percent.*”
- 2020 U.S. Census data indicated a **21.7%** population differential between our most and least populated single member districts, meaning SAISD must re-divide the districts to bring the differential back to 10% or less.

What are the requirements?

- Single member districts (SMD) must be drawn with no more than a 10% variance in populations.
- SMDs must be compact and contiguous.
- Compliance with Section 2 of the Voting Rights Act.
- Total deviation between largest and smallest SMD must be at or below 10%.

Additional Criteria

When possible:

- Use easily identifiable boundaries.
- Preserve incumbent-constituency relations.
- Maintain communities of interest and keep neighborhoods together.

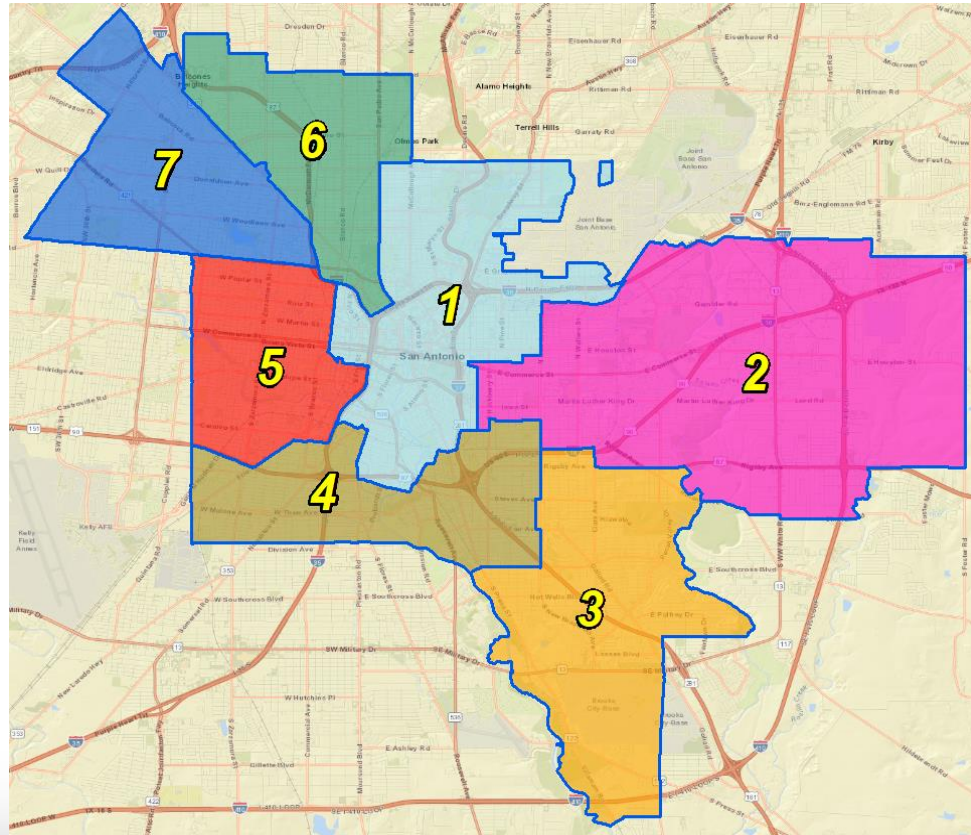

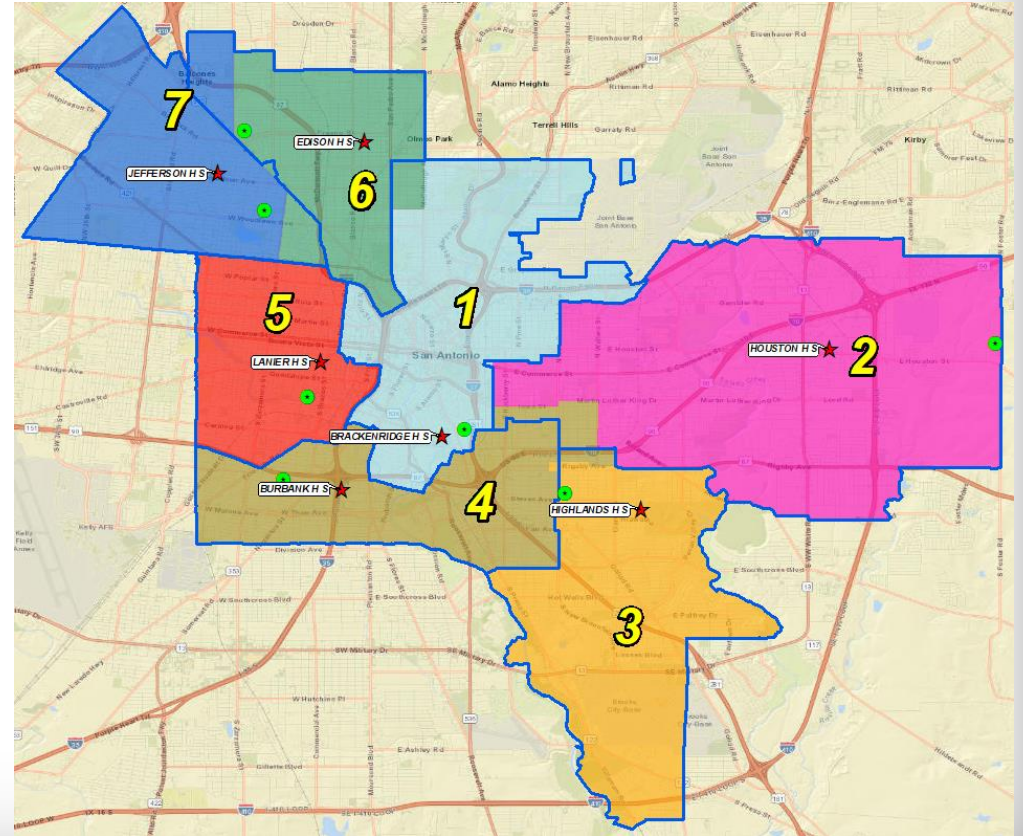

Current Map

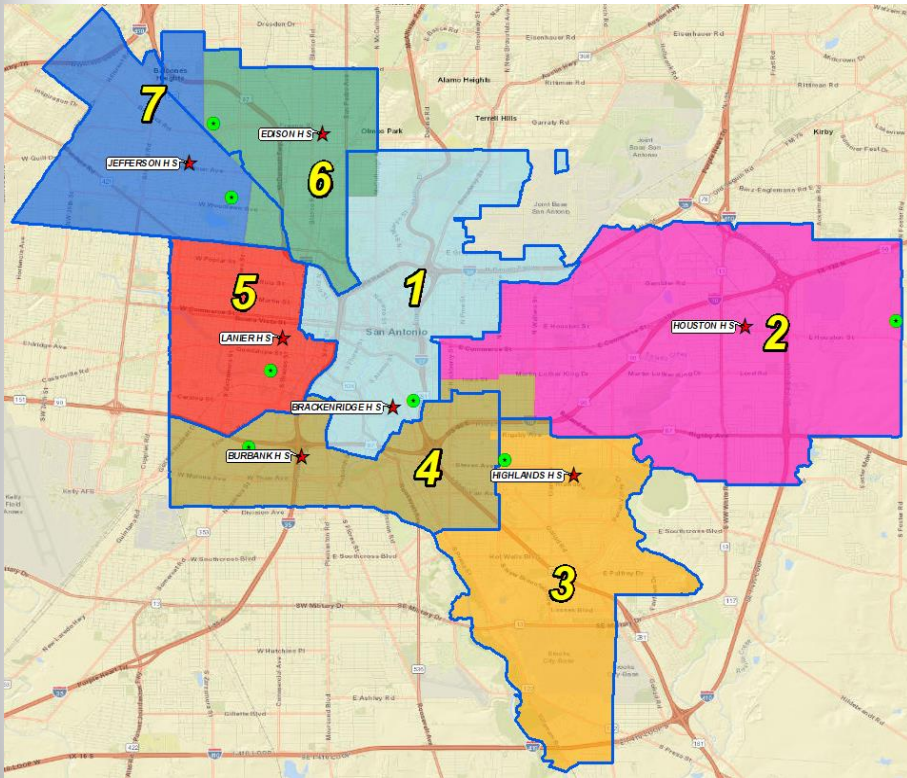


Draft Revised Map



Comparing Draft Revised Map with Current Map

(Blue border shows current boundaries)



- District 2 must be rebalanced to account for its higher population compared to other SMDs
- Districts adjusted to run along easily-identifiable boundaries where possible.
- Districts adjusted to align with High School feeder patterns as much as possible
- Existing boundaries maintained where possible.

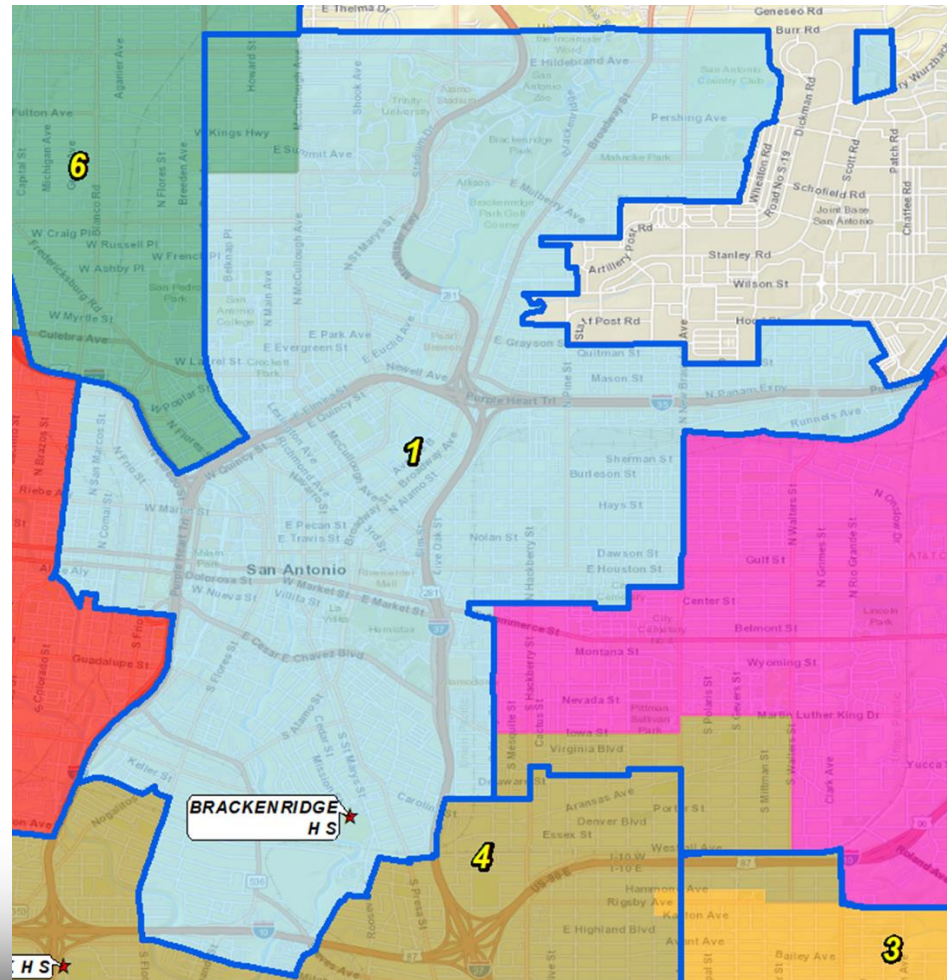

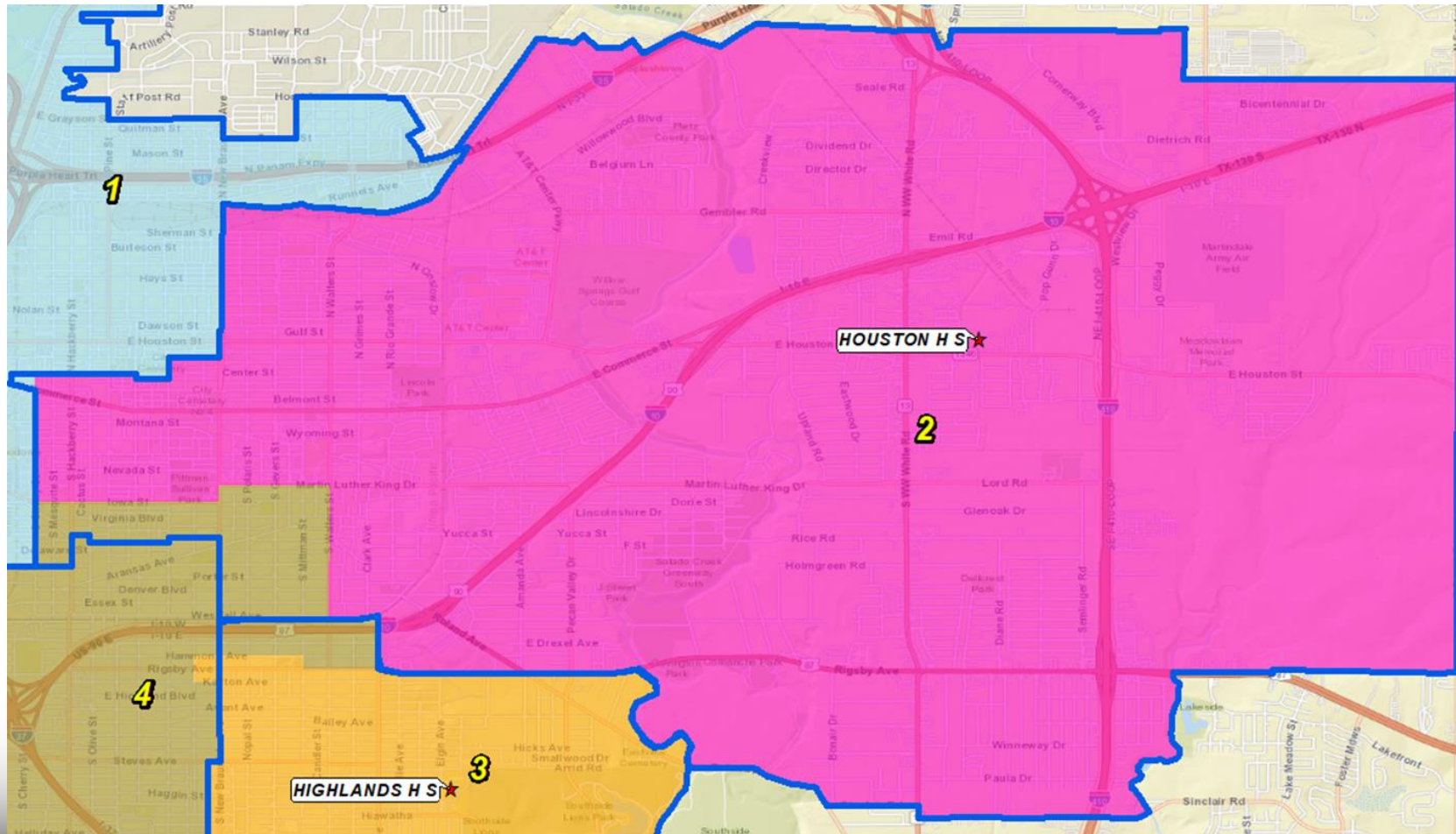

Note: The proposed map brings the difference between the most and least populous districts within 10% of each other.

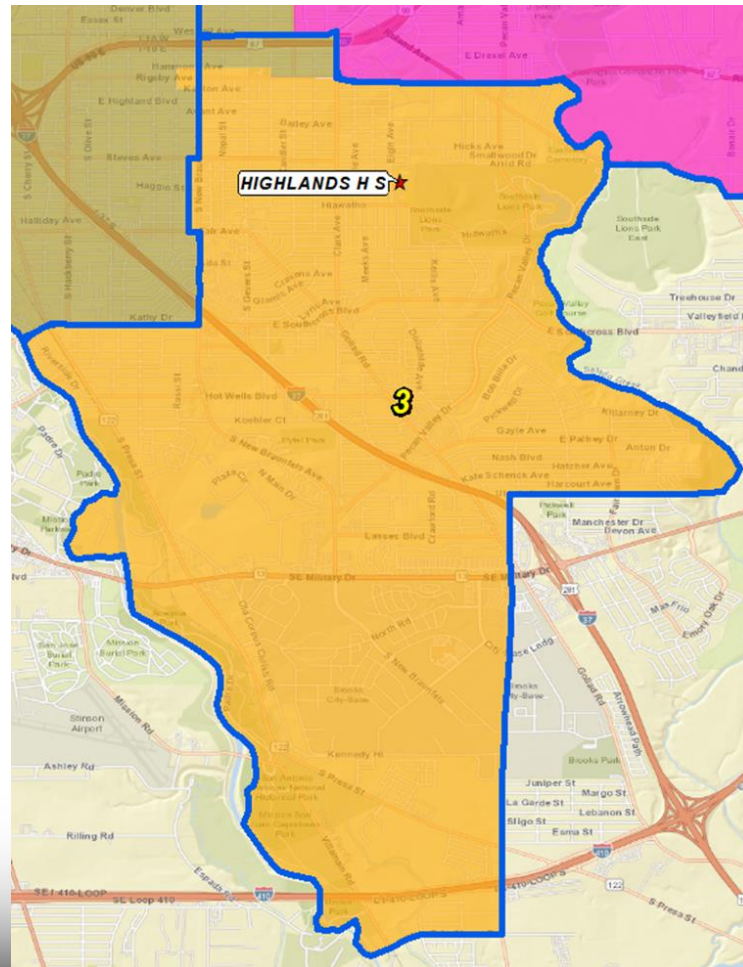
SMD 1 Draft Revised Map



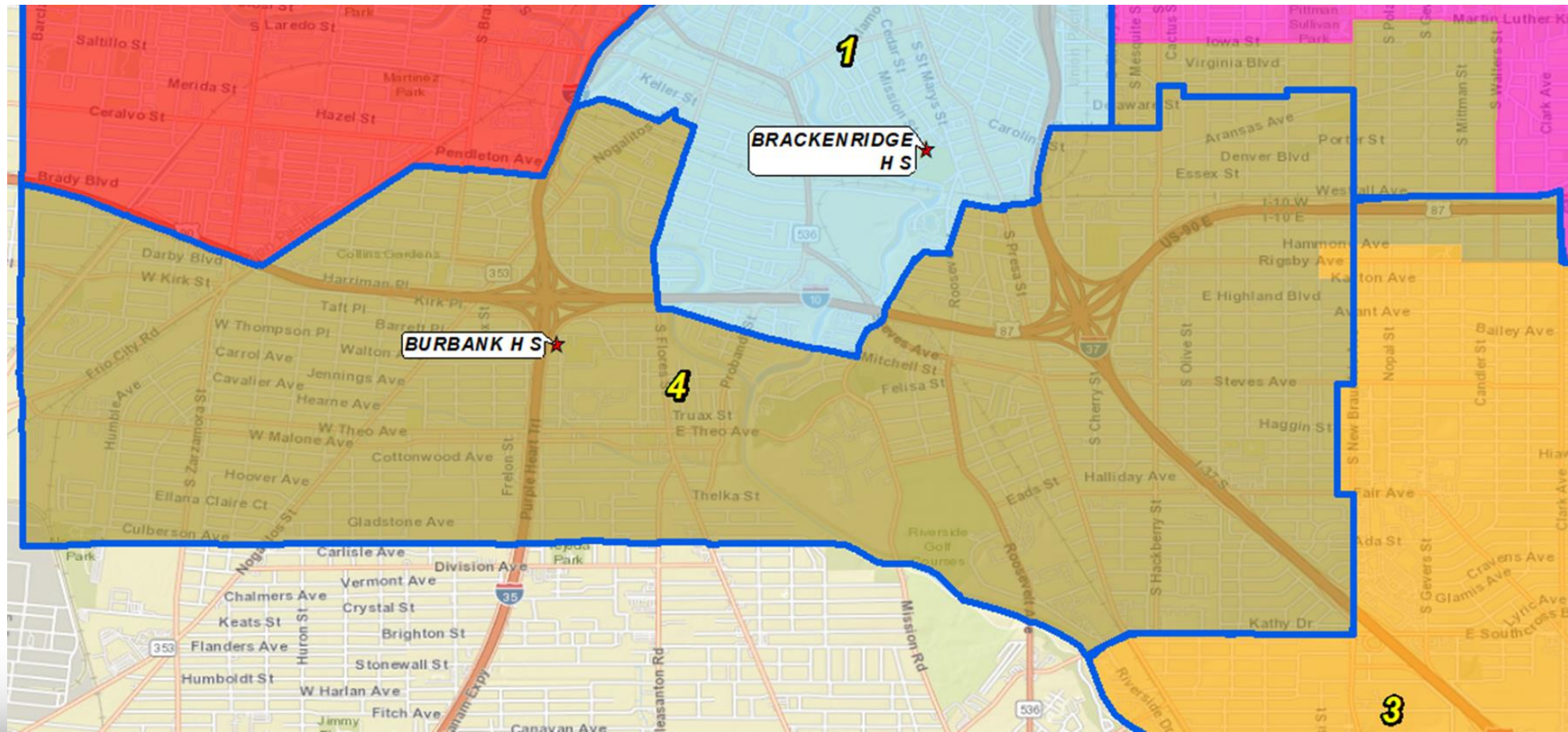
SMD 2 Draft Revised Map



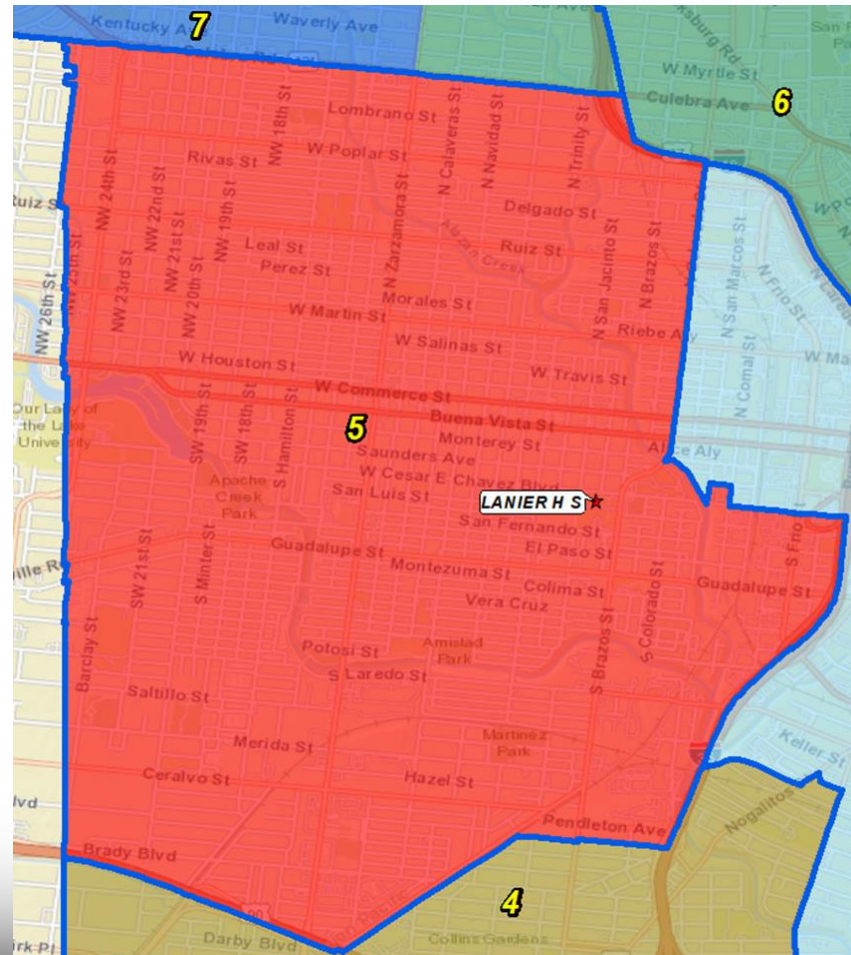
SMD 3 Draft Revised Map



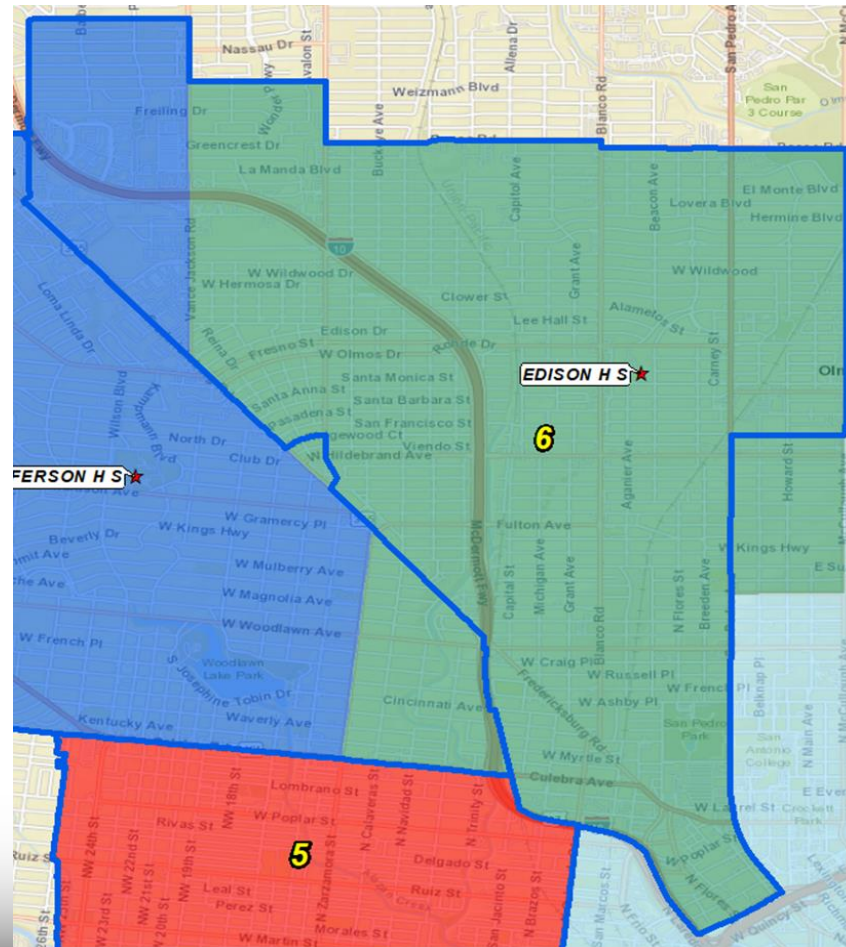
SMD 4 Draft Revised Map



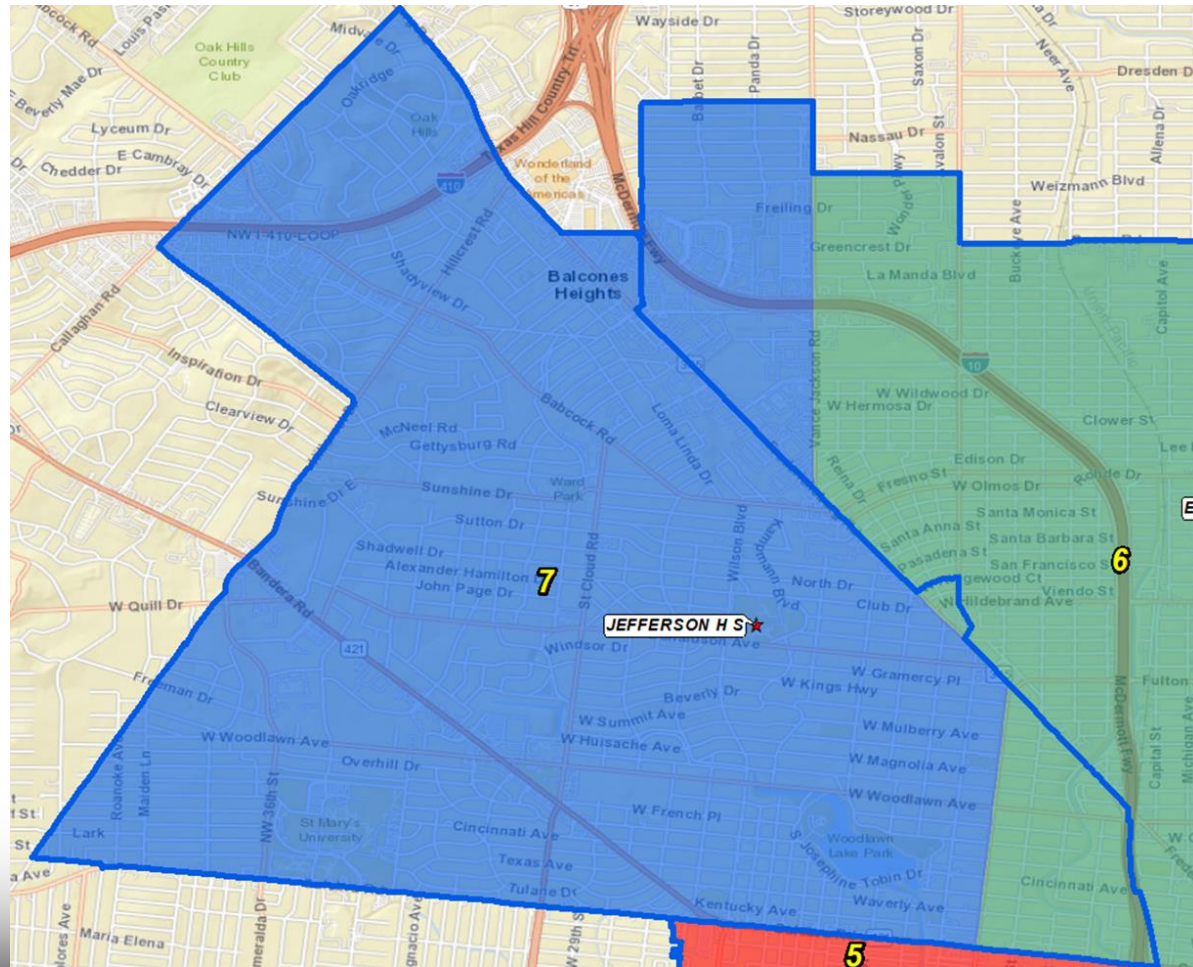
SMD 5 Draft Revised Map

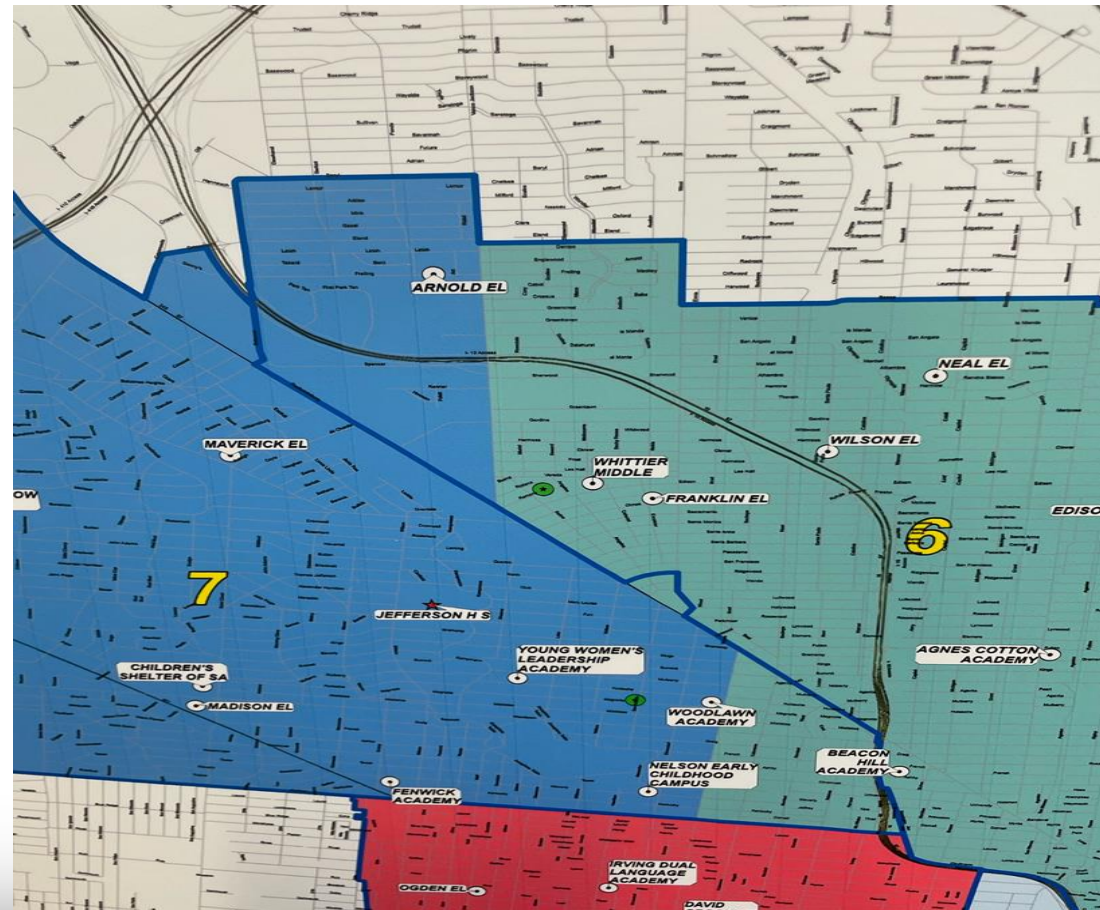


Campus Changes

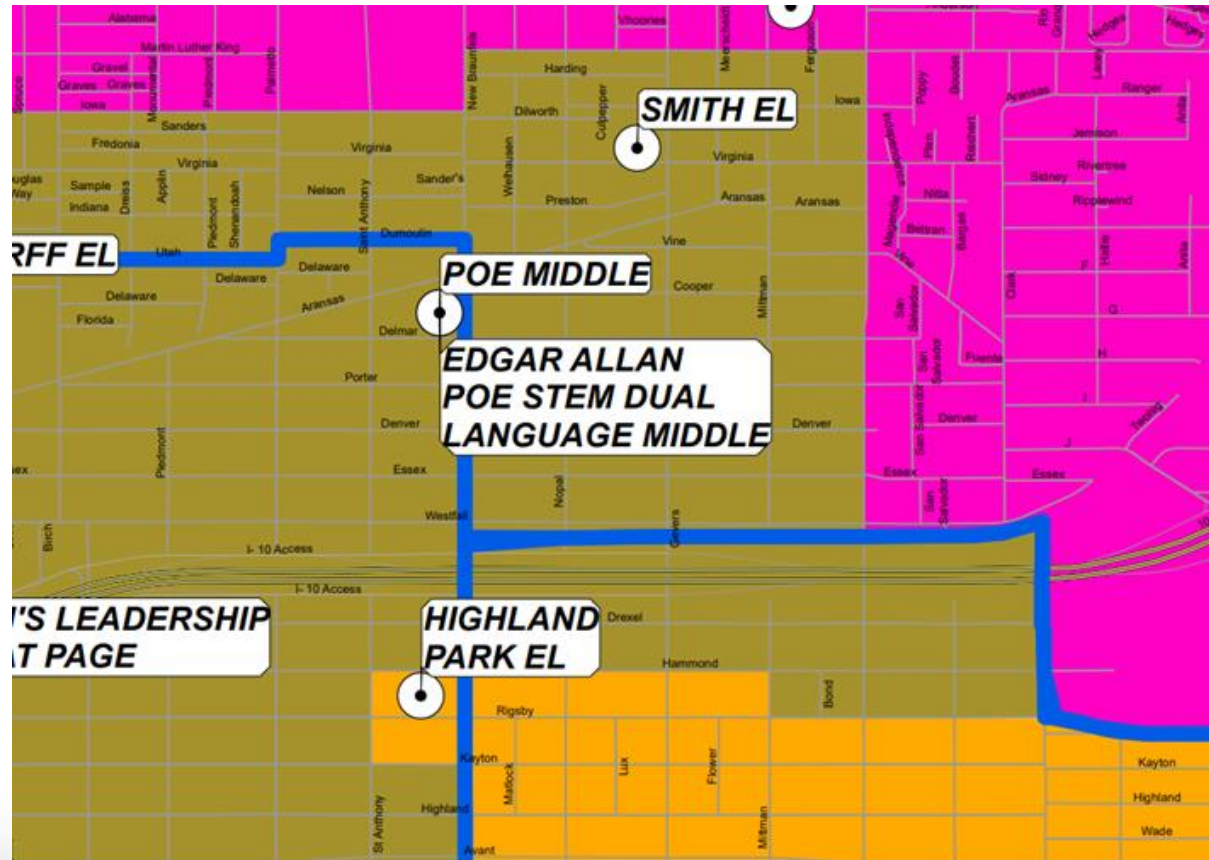
Current Map to Draft Revised Map

- Highland Park Elementary goes from SMD 4 to SMD 3

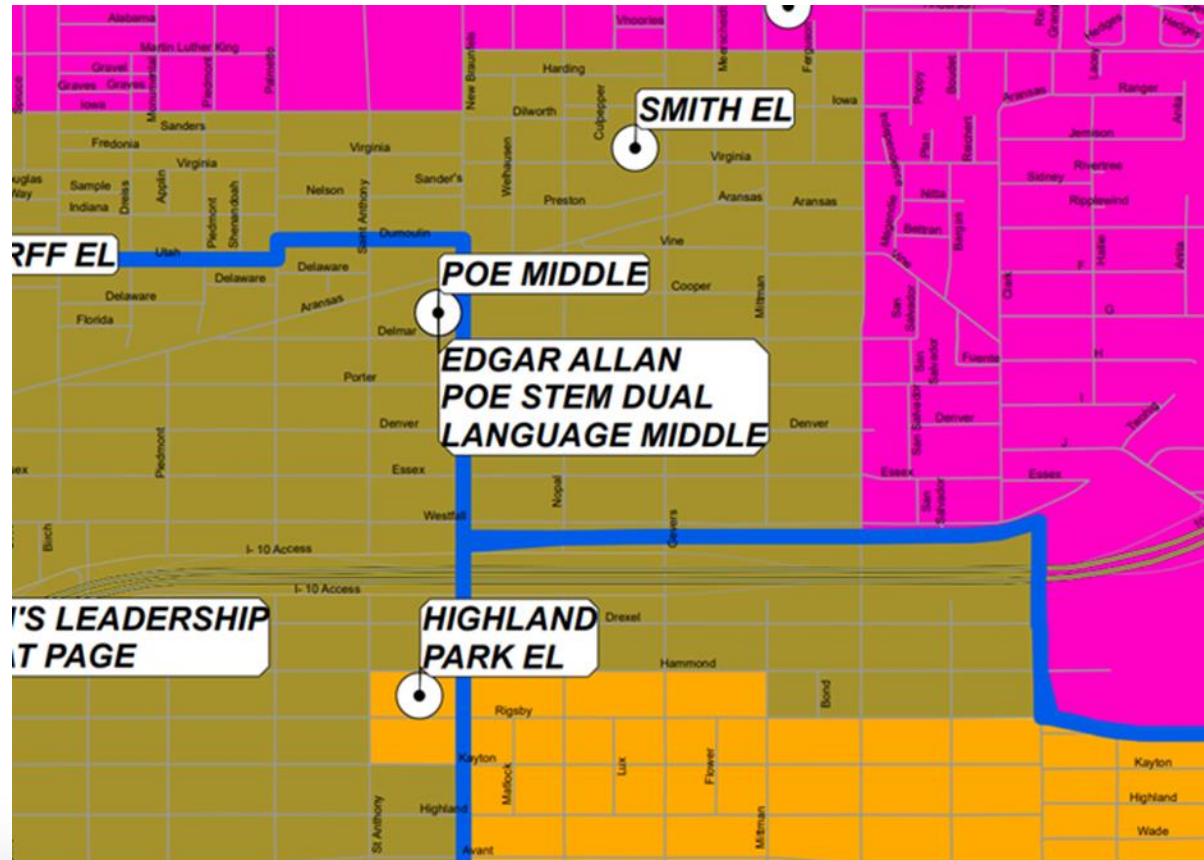
Arnold Elementary from SMD 6 to SMD 7

Next Steps

- Gather community input.
- Board of Trustees must adopt a new map.
- Not later than the 30th day after adoption, SAISD must notify the voter registrar of the county in which the area subject to change is located.

Transitioning to New Map

- The May 6, 2023 election will be the first to incorporate the new map. SAISD Trustee seats for single member districts 2, 5, and 6 are on the ballot.
- SAISD will communicate information about the new map to the community via the District website, social media, and newsletters.

Additional Information

- Redistricting will not change the outermost boundary of SAISD. All SAISD households will remain within SAISD.
- Redistricting does not impact school attendance zones in any way.
- Redistricting for SAISD is not a choice; it is a requirement based on 2020 U.S. Census data.

Community Input

- The SAISD Board of Trustees encourages members of the SAISD community to provide feedback on the proposed map in one or more of the following ways:
 - September 13—Whitter Middle School (SMD 6)
 - September 20—Highlands High School (SMD 3)
 - September 21—Jefferson High School (SMD 7)
 - September 28—Brackenridge High School (SMD 1)
 - September 29—Burbank High School (SMD 4)
 - October 4—Sam Houston High School (SMD 2)
