Notice of Voter-Approval Rate: The highest tax rate the district can adopt before requiring voter approval at an election is \$1.491600. This election will be automatically held if the district adopts a rate in excess of the voter-approval rate of \$1.491600. **Fund Balances** The following estimated balances will remain at the end of the current fiscal year and are not encumbered with or by a corresponding debt obligation, less estimated funds necessary for operating the district before receipt of the first state aid payment.
