

Board Goals

Improve reading and writing outcomes for all students:

Increase the percentage of all students who meet or exceed state grade level in reading across all grades from 35% in August 2022 to 50% in August 2027.

Improve math outcomes for Black students:

Increase the percentage of Black students who meet or exceed grade level in math across all grades from 16% in August 2022 to 50% in August 2027.


Improve college readiness for students with disabilities:

Increase the percentage of students with IEPs receiving instruction and services in the general education setting who meet the TSI College-Ready Standard in reading and math from 4% in August 2022 to 30% in August 2027.

Improve social emotional readiness in all students:


Increase by 25% the percentage of all students who meet the SAISD Standard for Social Emotional Readiness from the August 2024 baseline to baseline +25% in August 2027.





Significant changes to 2022-23 assessment/accountability.

STAAR REDESIGN

New Types of Questions on STAAR

Students will have to answer fill-in-the-blank, open-ended questions, multi-part questions, revising and editing, and analyzing/synthesizing information through open-ended response.

Writing Evaluation included in all Reading Assessments

Previously, Writing was only included at grades 4 and 7 but is now included in grades 3 - 8 as part of all Reading assessments.

ACCOUNTABILITY REDESIGN

District Accountability

District Ratings will no longer reflect the average performance of all students but instead the letter grades earned by campuses.

Updated Cut Scores & Targets

TEA increased several performance targets, such as the % of 2022 graduates required for College, Career, & Military Readiness which went from 60 to 88 in order to earn an A rating.



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Our Challenges: Landscape Analysis



- County-wide enrollment declined prior to COVID due to smaller student populations
- SAISD enrollment has declined 16%, or 9,000 since 2012, though increased in 2022.
- 70% of declines are due to a smaller under 18 population in the city.



- 79% of public school students residing in SAISD attend SAISD, relatively flat since 2018.
- SAISD enrolls more from other districts (open enrollment) than any other Bexar district.
- Roughly 10,000 SAISD residents attend a charter school.



- Declining births and an increasing number of families leaving the city before kindergarten are the leading causes of a smaller student-age population.
- Smaller entry cohorts have led to the largest declines at elementary, but those are beginning to impact middle schools and may soon impact high schools.




- More students leave the district each year than join.
- SAISD trends mirror peer Texas urban districts and are typically due to families seeking larger and/or more affordable housing, which leads them outside the city.



Our Challenges We are looking at excess capacity and rightsizing to efficient facility usage. While SAISD's State ranking by district enrollment has changed from #10 to #23 over these years, the ranking by district for the number of schools has changed from #5 to #7. SAISD has an estimated 52% excess capacity in its school 2016-201 2014-201 2013-201 2015-201 2017-201 buildings. 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Our Challenges

We need to look at elevating the teaching profession to address a teacher shortage.

- Texas ranks **28th** in overall salary (NEA 2022)
- Research also shows that starting teachers earn about **19% less** than other college-educated workers with similar characteristics
- A first-year teacher with a bachelor's degree is essentially earning \$37 per hour.

 Target just increased their minimum pay to \$24 per hour.
