

### Today and Moving Forward: Accomplishments and Challenges



### SAISD Today: Accomplishments

#### We are already busy implementing Always Learning!

- We have completed a full audit of our special education services with the support of the Council of the Great City Schools
- We are in the process of revamping our school leadership development systems with the support of the Wallace Foundation
- We have provided our employees the largest compensation increase in the last twenty-five years
- We are embracing our community through an expanded system of advisory councils
- With our community we are developing profiles of thriving students, teachers, classrooms and schools



### SAISD Today: Challenges

- Student Performance: Although we are a B rated school district, we still have a long way to go.
- Underfunded: Texas is among the lowest states in the nation in per pupil funding.
- Social-Emotional Pressure: The social-emotional pressures on our students and our staff are greater than ever before.
- School Safety: Violence in our communities and our schools is on the rise.
- Teacher Shortage: Across America, teachers are harder to find, and working fewer years
- Excess Building Capacity: Enrollment and school-aged population have been declining for more than twenty years, but the number of schools we are operating is about the same.



### Our Challenges: Declining Enrollment

### District Enrollment Declines Significantly

- 56,812 students enrolled in 2003-04, ranking 10<sup>th</sup> in the State
- 44,568 student enrolled in 2021-22, ranking fell to 24<sup>th</sup> in the State






### Number of Campuses Remain Almost the Same

- 106 Campuses in 2003-04, ranking 5th in the State
- 100 Campuses in 2021-22, ranking 7th in the State



### Our Challenges: As Enrollment Declines, We Have More Schools than Our Students Need




\*Includes 2022 data for San Antonio districts and similar size districts in Texas.



## Our Challenges: Resource Inequity Resulting from Excess Building Capacity

The cost per student at our smallest elementary schools is **2.4 times higher** than the cost per student at our largest elementary school.

- · Largest elementary | 644 students
- · Smallest elementary | 109 students



**ELEMENTARY SCHOOL EXPENDITURES PER STUDENT** 

This inequity holds true for all school types

- · High Schools | 2.3 times higher
- · Middle Schools | 1.4 times higher
- · Academies | 1.5 times higher


