






### **STAAR Test Redesign**

- 4. Writing embedded into all reading assessments









Board Acts on FINAL Rightsizing Recommendation



# Building Repurposing - Overview



### Rightsizing Value:

Do not abandon buildings.

We are committed to finding a use for the building or the grounds that is suitable to the neighborhood.

### **Repurposing Key Concepts**

- Deep community engagement
- Building uses that meet community needs
- Partnerships and collaboration
- Repurposing Committee
- New uses will take time and resources





## Building Repurposing – Early Ideas

- Fine arts center
- Parks and green space
- Early childhood centers (age 0 3)
- Teacher housing
- Community center
- District professional development hub
- Small business incubator
- Recreation center
